In 1993, journalist and filmmaker Ed Harriman traveled to Serb-held territory to secretly film *A Town Called Kozarac*.

This film was one of the first television documentaries to expose the genocide that was being perpetrated on Bosnian Muslims.

Fifteen years later, Harriman, together with genocide survivors from the Bosnian town of Kozarac, will examine the documentary and the town of Kozarac as they appear in 2008.

This event is part of Fontbonne University's Bosnia Memory Project, dedicated to establishing an enduring record of the experiences of Bosnian genocide survivors.
