





Department of Education Awards \$400,000 Title III Grant to Fontbonne

A \$400,000 Title III Grant from the United States Department of Education has been awarded to Fontbonne. The award is the largest non-student aid grant received in the history of the College.

The two-year grant has been given under the strengthening Developing Institutions Program, Title III. Grants are awarded to selected institutions of higher education to assist them in strengthening their academic quality, administrative capacity and student

Provisions of the grant allow for the establishment of a continuous planning process, the upgrading of the institution's administrative potential, and the broadening of Fontbonne's management information system.

Monies will also be used to offer additional professional growth opportunities for faculty, and to further develop the faculty governance system.

Under provisions of the grant, four areas of service will be expanded. These include: programs for the adult learner; the Learning Center, established in 1977 to assist those students with low college placement scores; the Human Services Major, offered jointly by the Departments of Social Science and Psychology, with concentrations in childhood and adolescence, alcoholism and gerontology; and programs for multi-cultural opportunities in teacher education.

The grant will provide for improvement in the Career Development Program through such services to students as self-assessment and career assessment, interpersonal skill development and placement.

In addition, the College's fundraising capability will be further developed, and college personnel will be trained in the skills necessary to organize, strengthen, and/or implement fund raising efforts.

Under the provisions allowed for by the grant, staff positions have been created to carry out the tasks of the above programs, and an administrator has been appointed to facilitate the grant.

Four Elected to **Board of Trustees**

Four new members have been elected to Fontbonne's Board of Trustees. They are Sister Frances DuFaux, CSJ; Sister Mary Tobias Hagan, CSJ; Mr. Robert J. Senkosky; and Mr. Gregory B. Vatterott.

The appointments, each for a three year term, bring to 15 the number of members serving on the board. In addition, there are six Trustees Emeriti.

Sister Frances DuFaux is the director of St. Joseph's Home for Boys, a residential treatment program for children with behavioral, emotional, familial or educational problems.

Sister Mary Tobias Hagan, former chairperson of the Department of Music at Fontbonne, is Regional Superior and Interim Planning Coordinator of the St. Louis Province of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet.

Mr. Senkosky, a funeral director at Kriegshauser Mortuaries in St. Louis, was assistant superintendent of the Catholic School Office of the Archdiocese of St. Louis for 18 years—the first layman to receive the appointment.

Mr. Vatterott is president of Charles F. Vatterott and Co., a St. Louis development and construction firm. Before assuming his present position in 1974, he served five years as a practicing attorney and two years as an estate attorney.

Soccer Team Ends First Season with Winning Record

The Fontbonne College Soccer Griffins ended their first season with a winning record, an incentive for upcoming years, and a delighted coach and athletic director.

"We did phenomenally for a first year team," said Dana Ingerson, Director of Athletics. "Soccer Coach Jack Jamieson and I are very happy."

Last spring, the College's Finance Committee approved twenty \$1,000 scholarships for the development of a men's soccer team. With the scholarship money, Ms. Ingerson and Jamieson were able to recruit eleven athletes to the soccer team and to the College as well. Four additional players bring the team's total to 15.

Nine scholarships are still available for subsequent years.

The team completed the season with an 8 win 7 loss record, and the satisfaction of beating Belleville Area College, Belleville, Ill., the fifth nationally-ranked junior college soccer team in the country. On October 7, 1981, the Fontbonne team finished with a 4 to 1 victory over the Belleville

"I believe the soccer program was beneficial to Fontbonne, not only in the expansion of the Athletic Department, but in the positive development of campus morale," Ms. Ingerson

Currently, the team is not affiliated with a local conference or national association. But, according to Ingerson, securing an affiliation is the major goal for the upcoming year.

Course on Holocaust

In an effort to bring the Fontbonne College community another aspect of religious consciousness, the Department of Religious and Philosophical Studies is offering a course on the Holocaust.

Entitled "Special Topics—The Holocaust," the course was new to the campus in Spring Semester 1981. It will be offered the second time in Spring Semester 1982, on Wednesday evenings. It carries three credits.

Instructor of the course Jacqueline Z. Pastis said although the class is a general overview of the Holocaust, the focus is on the reason why six million Jewish people were murdered.

Working closely with the St. Louis Center for Holocaust Studies, Ms. Pastis plans to incorporate films, slides, photos and guest lectures by survivors of the Holocaust in her class.

Honor Societies Established to Recognize Major Donors

Three honor associations have been established at Fontbonne College to extend special recognition to major donors who have provided distinguished leadership and achieved certain levels of annual giving.

The associations are The President's Associates, the Tower Society and the Arcade Society. Persons contributing to these three honoring societies between July 1, 1981 and June 30, 1982 will be recognized for Charter Year Membership. These three honorary associations join the already established Century Club.

The honorary title of President's Associates is given to persons who make annual gift commitments of \$1,000 or more. Charter year membership for this society will be conferred at the upcoming First President's Associates Recognition Program. This program will become an annual event to honor all associates and new members.

Benefactors whose gifts in a given year range from \$500 to \$1,000 are enrolled in the Tower Society. Donors making gifts from \$250 to \$500 will be listed in the Arcade Society and the Century Club honors individuals contributing \$100 to \$250.

The Tower Society derives its name from the historic clock tower in the courtyard at Carondelet, 6400 Minnesota Avenue in St. Louis, the provincial house of the Sisters of St.

Joseph of Carondelet. The Arcade Society is so named for the arcades which join Fontbonne's three original buildings, Ryan, Science and Fine Arts Hall on the College campus.

Membership in all associations is open to alumni, parents and friends of the College. Gifts may be unrestricted (this form of giving is encouraged), or restricted to a specific educational purpose such as a particular department, program or fund.

'Math/Science Network' **Sponsors Conference** at Fontbonne

"Expanding Your Horizons in Mathematics and Science," a conference sponsored by The Math/Science Network of Greater St. Louis, will be presented at Fontbonne on Tuesday, March 9, 1982.

The annual conference, for seventh through twelfth grade young women and interested adults, will be held simultaneously at St. Louis Community College at Florissant Valley.

Conference goals include: to increase young women's interest in mathematics and science; to foster awareness of career opportunities for women in mathematics and sciencerelated fields; and to provide students with an opportunity to meet and form personal contacts with women working in traditionally male occupations.

The Math/Science Network is made up of women educators from the fields of mathematics and science on both the high school and college levels throughout the metropolitan

Carol Freeman, chairperson of the Department of Mathematics, and Pauline Bellavance, assistant professor of chemistry, are co-chairpersons of the event along with two members of the mathematics faculty at St. Louis Community College at Floris-

The Network sponsored its first conference on this topic in March 1981 at the University of Missouri, St. Louis. More than 400 St. Louis area students participated in the event with another 300 unable to attend because of limited space.

High on the Ratings: Fontbonne's Major in Broadcasting

Eleven men and women are enrolled in the College's new program combining liberal arts learning and broadcast industry training

At a microphone in an announcing booth, a
Fontbonne student "delivers" a simulated radio
newscast which will be tape-recorded and critiqued
by an instructor. In a nearby production studio,
another Fontbonne student, assisted by a veteran
broadcast journalist, works at mixing words and
music to produce a radio commercial. Other
Fontbonne students are presenting non-aired
television sportscasts, learning the master control
board, producing audition tapes and participating in
seminars on broadcast management, advertising, and
marketing.

The students are getting these practical learning experiences at Broadcast Center, a professional school of broadcasting in downtown Clayton, Mo. The Center is located three miles from the Fontbonne campus and

has been in operation for ten years. Last year the College and the Center began a program affiliation which allows students interested in a broadcast career to combine a liberal arts education at Fontbonne with the industry training program at Broadcast Center. The new four-year program is a major in Broadcasting offered through the Department of Theatre.

Fontbonne established the Broadcasting major by licensing the coyrighted curriculum of Broadcast Center. During the first three years, Fontbonne students study liberal arts and broadcast-related courses. In the senior year, students complete their liberal arts studies at Fontbonne and undergo concentrated training in all aspects of the broadcasting industry at Broadcast Center. Facilities there include 10 announcing booths, three master control rooms, five production studios, two editing booths and three television studios.

Students are taught in classes and seminars (and tutored privately in advanced studies) by instructors currently working in the industry. After completing the required courses, the student receives the B.A.

The new major provides students with "the finest professional training available within the context of a liberal arts education," Sister Mary Charity, chairperson of the Department of Theatre, says. "It combines a solid background in the fundamentals of drama—acting, directing, producing, and criticism—with broadcast training.

"All aspects of communication, especially broadcasting and theatre, are interrelated today," she continued. "Performers become producers, disc jockeys become actors, actors are hosts of television programs, announcers act in motion pictures, and radio drama has returned. It is really one big business."

By establishing the Broadcasting major, Fontbonne responded to the need in the communications industry for broadly educated, versatile professionals. Addition of the new major to existing concentrations in the Theatre Department expands the variety of fields in which students can specialize. (Besides Broadcasting, concentrations offered are: theatre/performance, theatre/education, theatre/technical, public relations, theatre/music and theatre/business.) The Broadcasting major will create more career options, Sister Mary Charity believes, and should attract to Fontbonne students who seek practical preparation for the broadcast industry combined with a liberal arts background.

The combination brought Barbara Adler to Fontbonne. She enrolled last fall in the Broadcasting major, a transfer student from Meramec Community College in St. Louis where she earned the two-year degree, the Associate in Arts in Communictions Arts. A native St. Louisan and a graduate of Clayton High School, Mo., Barbara's ambition is to be an investigative reporter. "I wanted a degree from Fontbonne," she explained, "but I also wanted the Broadcast Center training. Having both will put me in an advantageous position when I compete for jobs."

Barbara is enrolled full time in the Department of Theatre, taking 16 hours of course work. "I'm studying French and loving it," she says enthusiastically, "and I'm taking Acting, Voice and Diction—and other stupendous courses at Fontbonne. At Broadcast Center on Tuesdays and Thursdays I study Broadcast Communications and Electronic Journalism."

She praises especially the small classes and the personalized instruction at both institutions. "With small group and one-on-one instruction at Broadcast Center you find out who and what you are and can be. At Fontbonne, personalized attention from teachers helps you focus more clearly on your career. My advisor, Sister Mary Charity, studies my program and confers with me, giving advice, kindness and assistance. When I graduate from Fontbonne next May with the B.A. in Broadcasting, I'll have had excellent career guidance and a first-rate education.

"I want to be a professional in my field," Barbara says. "And I'll make it—thanks to the Fontbonne College/Broadcast Center program. It's a winning combination."

Printout on Computer Science

New Program in Department of Mathematics

A recent forecast by the United States Department of Labor stated that "the need for computer specialists in business and government, which doubled in the 1970s, will double again in the 1980s."

That report, published in "News Notes," the newsletter for the Association of Governing Boards of Universities and Colleges, went on to say that "colleges should expand their production of computer personnel."

The Department of Mathematics at Fontbonne College is doing its part to educate students to become computer science professionals. Within the past two years, a mathematics/computer science major has been established in the department. The primary objective of this curriculum, according to Chairperson of the Department Carol Freeman, is to produce computer science graduates able to make immediate contributions to business and industry. Additionally, the curriculum is designed to qualify students to pursue graduate studies in mathematics, applied mathematics, computer science, or business. There are currently 19 students majoring in mathematics/computer science at Fontbonne. Another 95 students take computer science courses each semester.

Professor Freeman said the major in computer science was created after studying current market trends and talking with computer professionals who recommended that Fontbonne's mathematics graduates have more computer science background.


A graduate of the mathematics / computer science program will have the knowledge of at least four languages: COBOL, FORTRAN, assembler, and BASIC. Two specific features of the program are: a curriculum which provides a strong mathematical background with applications oriented toward business; and a curriculum designed to meet the needs of businesses in St. Louis and other metropolitan areas.

Professor Freeman, along with the other full-time Mathematics faculty members Mary Abkemeier and Elizabeth Newton, agree that students are attracted to this major because of the availability of positions and the excellent starting salaries. In 1981, annual starting salaries for Fontbonne mathematics graduates averaged \$20,500.

Individualized attention is one of the greatest assets of the mathematics / computer science program at Fontbonne, according to a consensus of students majoring in or taking courses in the department.

Linda Appelbaum, a sophomore in mathematics/computer science who came to Fontbonne on a Dean's Scholarship, said, "I like the program and the special attention I receive. If I have a problem, the professors readily give me the assistance I need."

Another mathematics / computer science major, Diane Willard, chose Fontbonne's program over that at another institution because "in a small school students receive more personal help." Diane's older sister, Judy, a 1981 graduate of the Department of Mathematics, is employed at Ralston Purina in the computer division.

Professor Freeman explained that, in addition to the professor's help, assistance from other students is encouraged. A course entitled "Computer Consulting" allows selected students to earn one hour of academic credit at no tuition charge each semester for helping others with their computer problems. These computer consultants, as they are called, work with students at specified times each week.

Computer science majors also gain professional work experience through the Cooperative Education Program at Fontbonne. This program allows students to choose up to three semesters of cooperative work at local corporations and firms. In Fall Semester 1981, five mathematics / computer science students participated in Co-op.

A recent New York Times article stressed the need for students trained in "software" applications — that is, creating programs for computers. "Our students in the mathematics / computer major are trained in 'software'," Professor Freeman said, "and their expertise will continue to be in demand." The skill to apply knowledge to the solution of real problems has been taught and developed, she believes, through Fontbonne's sound program combining a strong mathematics background; experience with a large IBM computer system; comprehensive knowledge of COBOL language; and individualized instruction which spurs creativity.

Linda Appelbaum types her program on the Decwriter, which, like all the terminals at the Center, is hooked into the IBM computer system at nearby Washington University.

From the President...

his message which opens my tenth year as president of Fontbonne College also marks the busiest year of the decade in which I have served, 1980–81.

The concept of service inspires all who strive to attain the goals of the College. The president's response to this ideal is interpreted in action on and off the campus. A brief description of some of the past year's activities illustrates the continuing effort to extend the breadth of service and, in so doing, benefit the College.

The meeting of a professional education association in addition to the National Federation of Carondelet Colleges required the Academic Dean, Sister Marie Damien Adams, and me to journey to our nation's capital. There we conferred with Missouri Congressmen on Fontbonne's continuing contribution to the quality of life and the expanded range of resources necessary to advance the college's programs. We met also with Fontbonne alumni in the Washington, D. C., area and called upon the National Endowments for the Humanities and the Arts to discuss with their representatives the feasibility of several funding proposals we are considering.

In other parts of the East we visited private education foundations and some of those funded by large corporations having their headquarters in New York City. The Academic Dean and I were guests of Fontbonne College alumni in New York and the Boston area. Their hospitality gave us the opportunity to give them more information on their college, its programs and plans.

In our efforts to share more of the "inside" of Fontbonne, we reach out not only to alumni, but to foundations, corporations, government, parents and friends. In our communication we emphasize who and what Fontbonne is, where we have been, where we are going and . . . why. We enlist the ideas of others and incorporate their insights into the college's growth and development plans. Increased interchange with our publics enables us to respond and serve more effectively.

Recently the College was notified that it has received a two-year Title III grant of \$400,000 from the United States Department of Education. (Details of the grant are given elsewhere in the magazine.) The success of the college's proposal indicates the willingness of the federal government to support program ideas which Fontbonne believes are important.

Two new academic programs are described in articles in this issue of the magazine. In its effort to serve a diverse student population, Fontbonne has opened its programs to students of the Broadcast Center in Clayton. This affiliation allows Broadcast Center students to work toward a degree in the Department of Theatre at Fontbonne; and Fontbonne students can gain an education in a media field which is developing rapidly.

A campus-based program which is attracting increased numbers of students is the Computer Science program in the Department of Mathematics. The demand for personnel capable of handling computers and data seems almost limitless, especially in business, industry, education, communications and the health care fields. Not only are these graduates eminently employable, but they are also preparing for the future of home computers which will handle a number of household and personal chores.

This fall, Fontbonne's enrollment remained stable, as it has for the past two years. The difference from previous fall semesters is that the increase in part-time students over the age of 25 has now reached 33% of the total student body.

To respond to this trend in higher education—the interest of adults in continuing their learning or initiating studies for a college degree, Fontbonne has employed an Adult Learner Coordinator. The responsibilities of the coordinator include surveying adult interests and preparing and marketing programs appropriate to this new clientele. The position is one funded by the Title III grant as Fontbonne reaches out to a new constituency.

During the past year, the College revamped its traditional publications in order to keep its publics better informed about Fontbonne's programs, activities, faculty and students, and its future plans. Two new major publications were initiated. *Update*, a printed 4-page newsletter is directed to the alumni audience. Its goal, as its name implies, is to transmit, generally without interpretation, current news on Fontbonne happenings which are of interest primarily to graduates. *Update* is mailed to alumni four times annually.

The Fontbonne College Magazine, published three times a year, is designed to communicate the college's story to its diverse publics. These include not only alumni, but also Fontbonne parents, faculty, staff, trustees, and friends; other colleges and universities; religious, cultural and professional organizations; public libraries; high school and junior college counselors; industrial, labor and business enterprises; and the print and electronic media. The first issue of the magazine focused on Fontbonne's reach "beyond its physical space" to serve the community through projects in Communications Disorders, programs in Business and the Fontbonne College art gallery.

In the development area we have inaugurated a new gifts and grants policy which applies, in part, to new opportunities for supporting the college financially. Donors who contribute in certain categories—the President's Associates, the Tower Society, the Arcade Society and the Century Club—make a commitment to the College in a special way and have the satisfaction of knowing they help in the continuation of quality education for succeeding student generations.

As Fontbonne looks to the future in this decade of the Eighties it has as one of its objectives to achieve an effective blend of philanthropic and federal support necessary to help the College achieve its educational purposes. The attainment of this objective will require the combined efforts of all who believe in the College. The contribution of self and means by members of all constituencies will be a thorough endorsement of Fontbonne's mission to serve humanity.
