Teachers and Students Attend Music Instruction Workshop For Pre-Schoolers

The first major workshop in the Midwest on **Kindermusik**, a West German pre-school music program adapted for American children, was held recently at Fontbonne.

Through demonstrations with children and curriculum instruction, music teachers interested in initiating the program gained practical advice. The three-day course, sponsored by the Department of Music, enrolled 27 teachers from 6 states and 14 metropolitan area communities.

Several Fontbonne music students benefited from the on-campus workshop by attending parts of the course and participating in discussions with experienced music teachers, reports Dr. Mary Ann Mulligan, CSJ, coordinator of the workshop and chairperson of the Department of Music.

Mathematics Department Hosts High School Competitions

Two hundred and forty-five students from 23 St. Louis metropolitan area high schools participated in the Twelfth Annual High School Mathematics Contest presented at Fontbonne in November.

Sponsored for the third time by the College's Department of mathematics, the competition was coordinated by Dr. Carol Freeman, associate professor and department chairperson.

Students were asked to solve 20 mathematical problems representing their particular grade level. Fontbonne faculty members performed the grading and individual, team, and school awards were presented.

In January, the Mathematics Department will sponsor another high school competition, the 4th Annual Computer Programming Contest. Coordinated by Dr. Mary K. Abkemeier, associate professor of mathematics, the competition, involving approximately 40 St. Louis area high schools, is conducted by no other college in the metropolitan area.

Contesting teams are asked to solve programming problems designed for students with the knowledge of an introductory course in BASIC. Members of the Mathematics Department faculty at Fontbonne judge the first round results which students work from their own facilities and mail to the College. The six highest scoring teams enter the final round conducted at Fontbonne and judged by computer professionals. Trophies are awarded to the first and second place teams.

Businesswomen Offer Expertise at Awareness Workshops

Sixty-eight women attended "Financial Awareness: Workshops for Women," presented at Fontbonne on Saturday, October 23. The all-day program was designed to help women gain knowledge and self-confidence in financial matters.

Sponsored by the College's Alumni Association in cooperation with County Bank of St. Louis, two workshops were presented by Fontbonne staff members—"Growth of Self-Image," by Gloria Smith, director of counseling, and "Career Planning for Women," by Ann Spiller, coordinator of career planning and development.

The Honorable Margaret M. Nolan, a Fontbonne alumna and Circuit Judge, St. Louis County, gave the session "Women and the Law." In addition, four County Bank officers each presented a workshop on financial planning.

Religious Ministry Program Now Offered at Fontbonne

A new in-service Religious Ministry Program was established at Fontbonne in September to meet the needs of persons interested in the study of Theology, Spirituality and Ministry.

Through an on-going series of non-credit workshops and short courses, the program offers opportunities for personal growth and development as well as professional certification in youth ministry, pastoral ministry, or ministry for the elderly.

Two to four courses of varied lengths and times will be offered each semester on evenings and/or Saturdays through the Office of Continuing Education.

Fontbonne Students Awarded Diabetic Study Grants

Two Home Economics students at Fontbonne have received \$2500 scholarship grants for diabetic study in 1982-83 from the American Diabetes Association, Greater St. Louis Affiliate.

Fontbonne is the first educational institution in the nation to receive the grants, earmarked for use by undergraduate students majoring in General Dietetics, reports Joseph J. Hanses, president of the St. Louis Affiliate.

Independent Music Teachers Discover Profit Is Professional

"Teaching Music for Profit" was the theme of a day-long seminar, held last summer at Fontbonne, co-sponsored by the American Music Conference and the Department of Music at Fontbonne.

Sixty-five independent music teachers representing four midwestern states learned the importance of incorporating good business practices with the art of teaching music.

Seminar leaders included Dr. Joseph R. Scotti, coordinator of the music business program at Fontbonne and initiator of the workshop; Patricia Taylor Lee, chairperson of the keyboard department at West Chester State College, Pennsylvania; J. Roman Babiak, executive director of the American Music Conference; Charlene W. Cox, assistant instructor of class piano and pedagogy at Kansas State University; Dr. Mary Ann Mulligan, CSJ, chairperson of the Music Department at Fontbonne; and Joe Hume, president of Hume Music Company, Topeka, Kansas.

In-depth articles on the seminar were published in recent issues of *Up Beat*, an international business magazine for music retailers, and *Clavier*, a national magazine for pianists and organists.

Inspiration Opportunities For Science Fair Participants

For the first time, Fontbonne was the site of a science information workshop to prepare students from Kindergarten through 12th grade for the annual Monsanto/St. Louis Post-Dispatch Science Fair of Greater St. Louis.

Approximately 300 students, parents and teachers attended the workshop, which was held Saturday morning, October 23, in the Science Building and Ryan Hall. Dr. Pauline Bellavance, associate professor of chemistry at Fontbonne, coordinated the workshop. Three faculty members gave presentations: Sister Rosemary Connell, CSJ, chairperson, Department of Natural Sciences; Tommie Frison, assistant professor of biology; and Beth Newton, assistant professor of mathematics. Fontbonne students gave laboratory demonstrations. Experts from business, industry and science education shared their expertise during the "How-To-Make-a-Science-Project" sessions. The Science Fair will be held in April of 1983.

The Fontbonne Report 1982

From the President...



I look back over 1981-82 with some satisfaction because the events that have taken place—goals accomplished, activities planned and carried out, decisions made—are consistent with my institutional goals and with my personal goals.

One of my presidential goals for 1981-82 was to develop further the religious identity and dimension of Fontbonne College. Studies were conducted to explore the feasibility of improving the offerings in theology and philosophy, and of establishing a religious education program. I am pleased to report that the College initiated this fall an in-service Religious Ministry Program in the Continuing Education division. The program offers opportunities for personal growth and development through core studies in theology, spirituality, and ministry. Students, lay and religious, can earn a certificate in a specific area of ministry.

The Religious Ministry Program, in addition to Fontbonne's offerings in theology and philosophy, makes concrete the institution's recognition of its responsibility to provide Church-related education; education which has as its goal service to the Church and the people of God. Students will be preparing for careers in ministry to youth and the elderly and for pastoral ministry. In establishing this program, the College reiterates its traditional dedication to religiously oriented education and recognizes the need for individuals prepared to meet new needs in society.

Another new program combining what is best in the Fontbonne College traditions is the Spanish for Commerce and Technology major. This four-year program which prepares students for employment in Spanish-speaking business and industry, opened for enrollment in September of 1982. Geared to practicality, useability and making a living in interesting fields of work, Spanish for Commerce and Technology demonstrates Fontbonne's commitment to "marketable skills" as stated in the Mission Statement.

Besides being forward-looking and practical, this new major is a return to the liberal tradition of offering a foreign language. French has always been available, but Spanish was dropped from our curriculum ten years ago. Spanish is now the largest language group in the United States, after English. Fontbonne's decision to establish the major in Spanish for Commerce and Technology was

realistic; yet the choice was also a reiteration of traditional commitment to the liberalizing properties of learning and using a language other than one's own native tongue.

Up-to-date offerings launched from the base of a quality academic program continue to attract increased numbers of students to our campus. Enrollment is up to 905 from last year's total of 882, an increase of 23 students, or three percent. Males now comprise 19% of the student body. When I became president in 1972, only 19 men were enrolled at the college. They now number 173. Coeducation is alive and well at Fontbonne!

Enrollment of non-traditional students continues to increase. These adults over 25 include re-entry students, men and women seeking personal enrichment, and adults pursuing career development or advancement. They come to us, part-time and full-time, from all points of the metropolitan area. We welcome their presence.

And we anticipated it. We engaged the College Board, a private, national service association, to conduct an adult learner survey in St. Louis City and St. Louis County. The project, funded by monies from the Title III grant we received from the U.S. Office of Education, is one of the few comprehensive market studies we know of to be conducted in this area by an educational rather than a business organization. Its first step was to analyze the community Fontbonne serves in order to determine demand for education among adults aged 25 and older. Detailed interviews of 550 adults and 30 employers, plus assessment of programs in operation by companion colleges, are helping Fontbonne to develop distinctive programs demanded by adult learners—the fastest growing segment of college enrollment today. To accommodate the adult student, the College has expanded administrative services and extended hours beyond normal operation. As a result, advisers, facilities, and other assisting services are now more readily available to the non-traditional student.

The increase in the number of part-time students who attend Saturday and evening classes indicates not only that Fontbonne is teaching the right courses, but also providing classes at the times convenient to its clientele. Larger enrollment among both part- and full-time adult learners also shows that students seeking a particular educational experience will make the financial commitment necessary to attend Fontbonne.

I am enthused about the air of excitement which pervades the campus. Expanded and renovated facilities, which have been improved ahead of schedule because of the water damage, have enhanced the appearance of the Fine Arts and Science Buildings. Enlarged facilities in the residence halls have been developed during the 1981-82 academic year, making it possible to accommodate more Fontbonne students on the campus. For the second consecutive year our dormitories have been filled to capacity.

Fontbonne provides a contemporary atmosphere in which motivated students pursue their goals. We have tried to communicate the vitality of the College in our publications and, especially the past year, through

coordinated marketing programs. The theme "Good Things Come in Small Colleges—Especially Fontbonne" is the phrase of visual focus in our new, colorful recruiting literature and displays. The theme was re-emphasized in the concentrated electronic advertising campaign conducted last year—using television for the first time as a marketing medium. Radio spot announcements used to recruit students in 1979 were updated, saving production costs, and integrated into this year's campaign. A survey of new students—freshmen and transfers—revealed that radio and television advertising ranked next to Fontbonne publications in influence on the prospective student. In continually assessing the results of our marketing programs we can determine whether their impact on enrollment justifies their cost. Evidence thus far indicates that the impact is significant.

The carrying forward of the College's development program through the past year to levels never reached before and the winning of a Title III federal government grant in the amount of \$400,000 are achievements deserving of special attention. Alumni contributions increased 31% and rose to a new high of \$74,336. Gifts and grants from all sources increased 18.5%. The balanced financial picture presented in the following charts and figures reflects Fontbonne's continuing commitment to and success in managing our resources prudently and effectively.

I would be remiss if I did not express the gratitude of all of Fontbonne for the fine support accorded the college by its various constituencies. A significant single gift came from the St. Louis Province of the Sisters of St. Joseph who turned over Southwest Hall to Fontbonne, free and clear of any debt. The building, formerly a property of the Province, is located on the campus and is used for college-related activities. Finally, a market study was initiated in March of 1982 to conduct a test of the response Fontbonne could expect from philanthropy to the College's five year needs.

By no means the least of this last year's activities was the year-long celebration of my tenth anniversary as president of Fontbonne College. The year was marked by many highlights: being named Woman of Achievement by the *St. Louis Globe-Democrat*; the specially composed and performed musical composition at a Celebration of the Liturgy; a gala dinner attended by friends of the College and family; being named Citizen of the Year by the City of Clayton; having a scholarship fund established in my name. While all of the foregoing provided a great deal of pleasure and excitement in one's life, the events themselves provide vehicles for publicity for the College and are excellent means of bringing Fontbonne into the spotlight.

The year 1981-82 has been one of growth and accomplishment for Fontbonne College. Join with me in enthusiasm for the Fontbonne of today, in optimism for a Fontbonne that will thrive tomorrow.

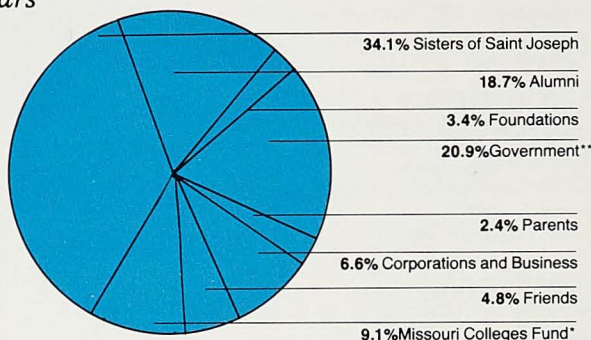

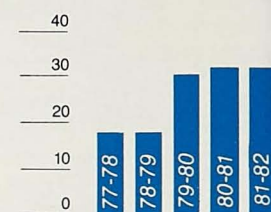

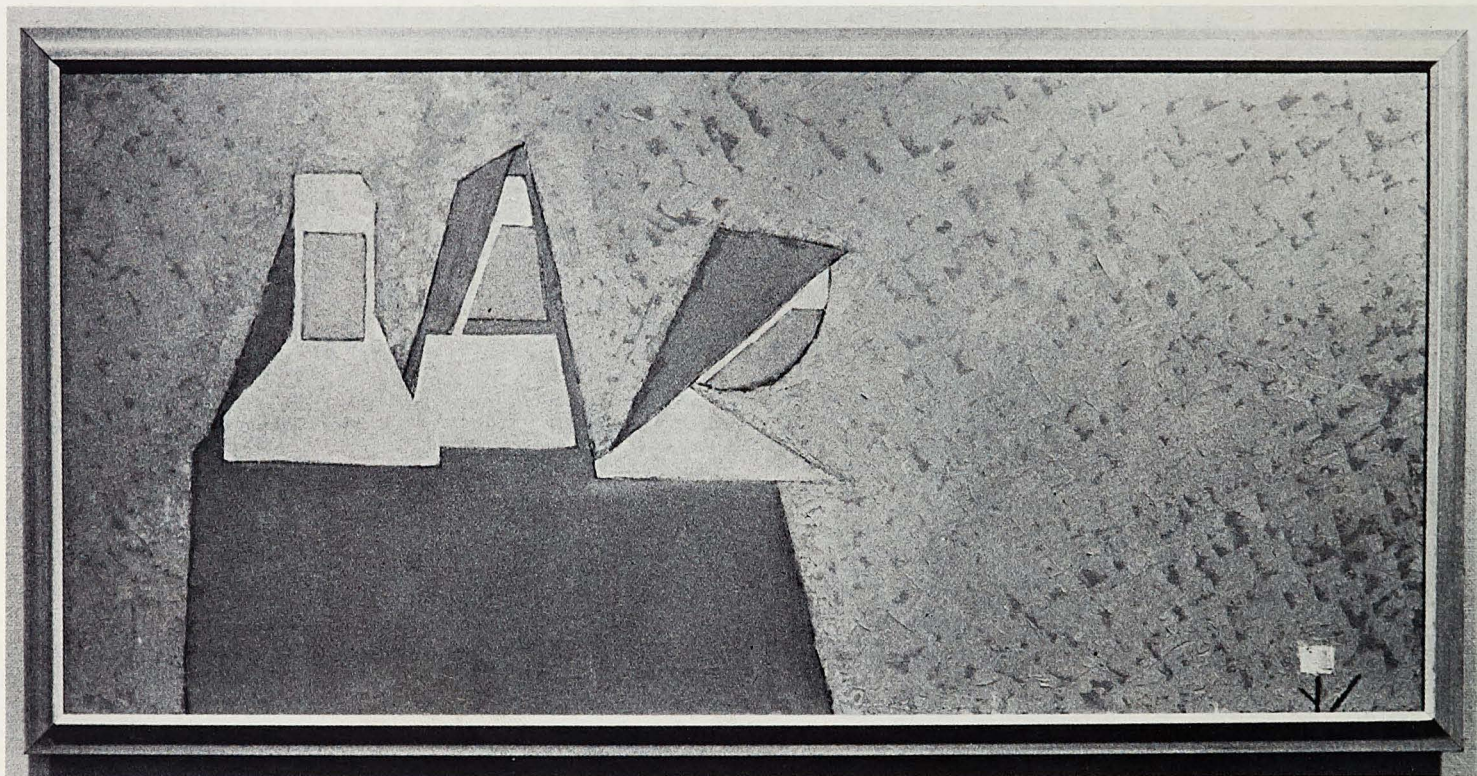
