#### THE AUTHOR:

Thornton Wilder, three times winner of the Pulitzer Prize and an outstanding figure in contemporary American letters as both novelist and playwright, was born in Madison, Wisconsin, on April 17, 1897. He attended Oberlin College and Yale University.

With the publication of his second novel, The Bridge of San Luis Rey, a 1928 Pulitzer Prize winner, Wilder achieved merited recognition here and abroad. His success as a playwright, however, came much later with Our Town, an experimental drama staged without scenery. This drama, as wellaas his controversial The Skin of Our Teeth, won him two other Pulitzer Prizes. At present, Mr. Wilder is at work on Plays for Bleecker Street, a double cycle of fourteen one-act plays, which is to be his artistic and philosophic summing up. Two plays from the cycle "The Seven Ages of Man" (of which Infancy is the first) and one from the cycle "The Seven Deadly Sins" (of which Someone from Assisi is the sixth) were produced early in 1962 at Circle-in-the-Square in New York City.

Wilder's theme is a traditional one in literature, and, when stated in oversimplified, bald prose, may appear trite. It is not what Wilder says but how he says it that is intriguingly new. Not only does he satirize many of the foibles and absurdities of American home life, but he also ridicules his own dramatic medium, the theatre, and most of the realistic theatrical conventions set up by Ibsen sixty years earlier. Wilder's approach to dramaturgy is sometimes called "nonrepresentational" because it does not try to represent on stage life as it is, and recognizes the stage's artificiality.
