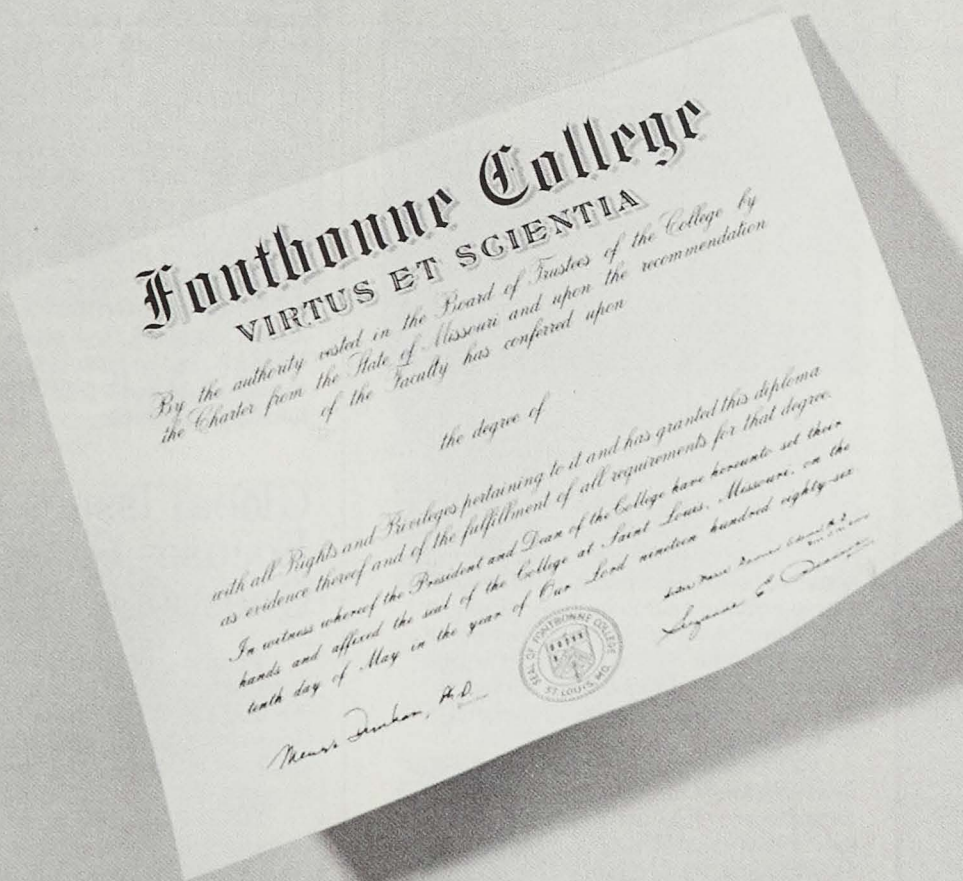

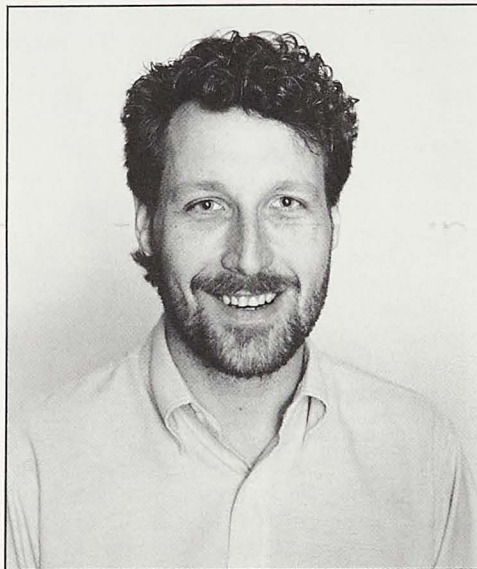

Did You Know?

Kin Receives Alumni Hood



Special education major Randy Kin, O.F.M., Conv., has been selected to receive Fontbonne College's Alumni Hood in recognition of his loyalty and service to the college.

The hood is given to the graduating senior who most demonstrates the potential to become an outstanding alumni. Kin was a past president of Fontbonne's Association for Special Kids, an organization that conducts toy drives for children and handicap awareness days at area schools.

Kin was a representative on the student teaching committee, and was the Department of Education/Special Education representative to the Student Government Association.

In addition to his work at Fontbonne, Kin coordinates the "door ministry"—helping to feed poor people at the door of the St. Bonaventure Friary where he lives. Kin also provides "respite care" for handicapped children and adults so that their parents can spend an evening out or take a vacation.

Kin is from Kirby, Ohio, and graduated from Upper Sandusky High School in 1971. He has been a member of the Order of Friars Minor, Conventional, since 1978.

Publications Awarded National Medals

The Fontbonne College Magazine was awarded a gold medal in national judging conducted by the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education (CASE). The magazine received one of only six gold medals awarded in the Periodical Improvements category, out of 108 entries.

Two admissions publications, the prospectus and the search piece, were selected to receive one of four gold medals awarded in the Publications Improvement category.

Boylan Appointed Soccer Coach



Kevin Boylan has been appointed coach for the soccer Griffins, reigning champions of the National Little College Athletic Association (NLCAA).

Boylan has coached several levels of club soccer, and currently coaches 12-year-olds in the Raiders Soccer Club in north St. Louis County.

Boylan owns Lift Truck, Inc., of St. Charles, Mo. He graduated from the University of Illinois at Chicago in 1971, with a bachelor's degree in education.

The soccer Griffins were 24-7-2 last season, and took first place in the NLCAA. In the past five years, the team won the NLCAA's prestigious Marycrest tournament twice.

Global Issues Series Focuses On Tough Questions

Fontbonne's Critical Global Issues Lecture Series ended this year with a discussion on "The Moral Implications of Genetic Research," attracting the largest audience to date for the two-year-old program.

Dr. Daniel Hartl, chairperson of the Department of Genetics, at Washington University, St. Louis, Mo., talked about the potential benefits and risks of genetic research with Dr. David C. Tiemeier, a research scientist in the Molecular Genetics Group at Monsanto Company, St. Louis, Mo.

Elizabeth McMillan, CSJ, director of ethics research for the Catholic Health Association of the United States, discussed the ethical questions of such research.

The Center for Critical Global Issues sponsors the series to encourage concern and involvement in a variety of global issues.

New Master's Program in Computer Education

Fifty-five students enrolled in classes for the first semester of Fontbonne's new master of science in computer education program. Students are being placed on waiting lists to register for fall courses.

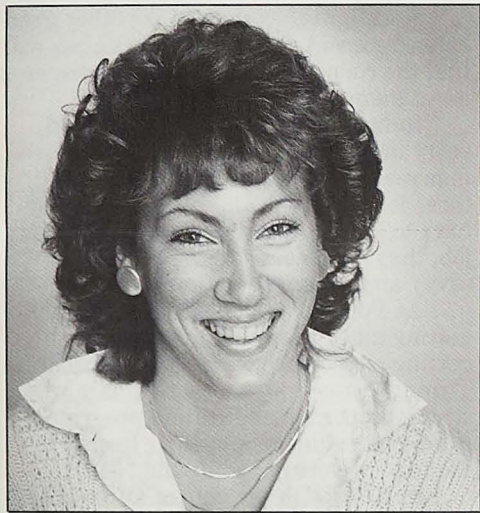
The departments of mathematics and computer science and education designed a program for individuals who could benefit from learning about computers for use in education, training and administration.

The program is designed for people with bachelor's degrees in any field.

Students may choose one of four specializations—using computers in the classroom, teaching computer science, coordinating computer usage, or they may custom tailor their own program with an advisor's approval.

Two Volleyball Standouts Named All-Americans

Two members of Fontbonne's 1985 volleyball team were named National Little College Athletic Association (NLCAA) All-America players.



Kim Hartmann, a 5'11" senior, was selected for the second consecutive year. Last year, she was also voted the team's Most Valuable Player and was named best front court player.



Junior Lisa Melsheimer, 5'6", was named All-America following her best year to date at Fontbonne. Melsheimer has been the team's best server for the past three years.

Fontbonne finished second in the NLCAA for the past two years, with records of 26-8 and 24-13, respectively.

Head of CSJs Receives Honorary Degree

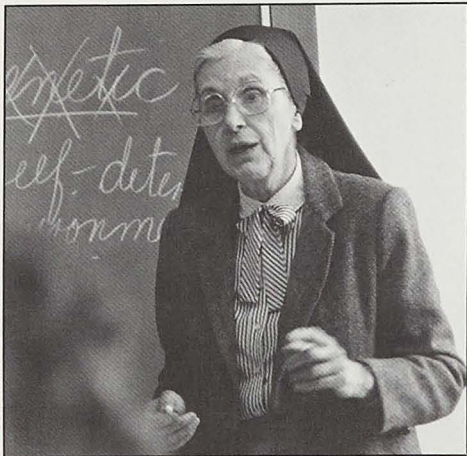


Sister Miriam Therese Larkin, CSJ, General Superior of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet was awarded a doctor of humanities, honoris causa, degree at the Fontbonne College commencement, May 10.

Sister Larkin was selected for her work in Catholic higher education and for her leadership within the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet. She taught philosophy and religious studies for 17 years as a professor at Mount St. Mary's College in Los Angeles, Calif. In addition to her work as general superior for her order, Sister Larkin is president of the National Leadership Conference of Women Religious.

The decision to honor the general superior of the Sisters of St. Joseph comes the same year the order is celebrating its sesquicentennial—150 years in the new world.

Sister Hickox Named Professor Emeritus



After 35 years as a member of the Fontbonne faculty, Sister Agnes Cecile Hickox, CSJ, retired at the end of the 1985-86 academic year.

In appreciation for her years of service, the college conferred the title professor emerita of psychology on Sister Hickox.

The Fontbonne board of trustees passed a resolution commending Sister Hickox for her contribution to Catholic higher education, specifically at Fontbonne.

Sister Hickox joined the Fontbonne faculty as an instructor in psychology in 1951. She was appointed chairperson of the department that same year.

In addition to her bachelor's degree from Fontbonne College, Sister Hickox earned a master's degree from Saint Louis University.

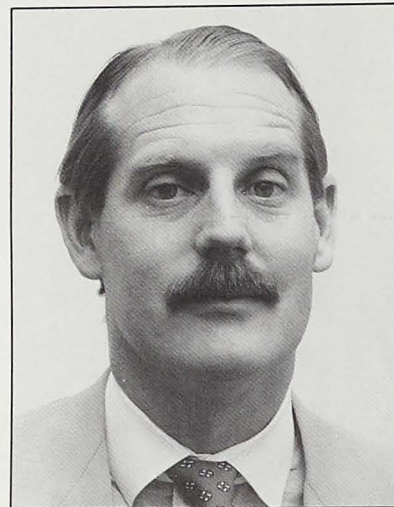
Sister Hickox is only the thirteenth person named professor emeritus at Fontbonne.

LESSONS IN THE CORPORATE CLASSROOM— LEARNING OUTSIDE THE HALLOWED HALLS

Summer's annual deluge of college graduates has arrived. Experts estimate in 1986 more than 1.2 million new-found owners of bachelor's and master's degrees will enter the nation's job market, eager to fight their way into the corporate world.

And fight they must. Like other graduates in recent years, this year's class will find the corporate world less than eager to greet them.

Industrial cutbacks have reduced entry level job openings. Fewer job openings mean tougher competition to get those jobs. Not only do college graduates have to knock on more doors to find that job, they must come armed with more savvy and preparation than ever.

At Fontbonne College, students are getting an edge on their competition by getting experience while going to school. Through internships, practicums, and a strong cooperative education program, Fontbonne students put their lessons to the test by working while they learn.

In 1976, with the help of a five-year federal grant, Fontbonne became the first college in the St. Louis area to systematically place students in paying positions as part of their education.

The Cooperative Education Program (Co-op) is 10 years old. It has proved so valuable a learning tool Fontbonne continued the program even after the grant expired in 1981. Cooperation from local, national and international companies such as IBM, Monsanto, and McDonnell-Douglas, have made it possible for students attending school in St. Louis to work there, too.

Theresa Schaltenbrand, a senior majoring in accounting and finance, worked as a co-op student at the accounting firm of Stone, Carlie and Co. in Clayton, Mo. "The classroom says, 'This is what will happen in this situation,'" Schaltenbrand said, seated at her desk at Stone, Carlie. "But here, well things are just different."

As an accountant, she has a primary client in addition to working on individual projects. "My main client is an individual with a lot of investments. His books are really hairy."

"He brings in his bank statements, MasterCard receipts and papers. If he sells something—one of his investments—he brings that in. I have to straighten it all out and put together the records he'll need for taxes next year," Schaltenbrand said.

Schaltenbrand works under the direct supervision of a certified public accountant who reviews all of her work.

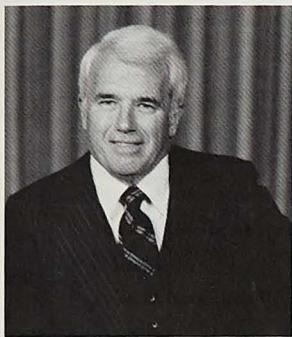

Fontbonne College— Growing With St. Louis

From the Chairman



Knowing that circumstances will mold our future if we don't decide to do so ourselves, Fontbonne began a renewed effort this past year to form a stronger college—a college which is more in control of itself and more in touch with the community.

Working with faculty and staff, trustee committees have looked hard at the need for the college to extend itself, to develop more financial resources, and to establish internal systems which will assure a fiscally sound and well-run educational organization. Under the administration of our new president, Meneve Dunham, Fontbonne has made steady and substantial progress this year toward realizing its goals.

Our deep gratitude goes to all of these people and organizations—to you. For Fontbonne, your dedication and enthusiasm, which will last far into the future, is the best sign.

No college raises money for the sake of raising money. Neither does Fontbonne. Many of the financial challenges which we have faced this past year continue to confront the great majority of private colleges. A declining traditional age student population, deferred maintenance resulting in deteriorating facilities, and a mandate to seek more resources from the private sector and less from government, have given greater urgency and motivation to our efforts.

Income in all categories is on the rise. The alumni has increased its giving by 30 percent. The College's trustees have tripled their contributions. Business donations are up 70 percent. Parents, faculty, staff, foundations and friends of Fontbonne have all increased their levels of support compared to last year. These are very positive signs.

From the President



In many ways this past academic year was a time of exploration for Fontbonne College. It was time to assess astutely the College's past and to move boldly in directions which will solidify the future.

We reaffirmed the goals crucial for the education we want to offer: academically excellent and in the tradition of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet. Another goal we considered significant to the career oriented liberal arts education we provide, was to explore ways to bring Fontbonne into the consciousness of the St. Louis community in a comprehensive way.

Included in our careful planning has been an exploration of ways in which the College could further its mission outside the central campus. We are very excited about the agreement signed this year to provide general education courses for nursing students at the Deaconess College of

Nursing. Members of our faculty will begin this fall to instruct Deaconess students at their facility, as discussions concerning the use of Fontbonne's library, class rooms and dormitories continue. The program to provide the third and fourth years of the bachelor's degree in business administration at St. Mary's College in O'Fallon, Mo., has been quite successful in its first year. Beginning fall 1986, our Saturday MBA program will also be offered at the St. Mary's campus. We continue to investigate ways in which we can provide our values-oriented education in educational environments.

Our main commitment remains, nonetheless, to our central campus. In a reorganized admissions effort, using newly designed literature, we have received more inquiries from prospective students than ever before. These results indicate that despite the national problem of finding students for colleges and universities, the kind of individual attention an education at Fontbonne provides remains attractive.

Financially dependent on tuition and the "living endowment" the Sisters of St. Joseph provided for so many years, the College now finds itself on the perimeter of the kind of corporate and foundation support which helps undergird this nation's educational institutions. This year our trustees, our alumni, our faculty, staff, and volunteers pooled talents to begin this complex and difficult undertaking.

A key event was the first Business Associates meeting held in January. The initial effort in an ongoing series of informational meetings provided the context in which business people were presented the Fontbonne "story" and asked for their suggestions, efforts and resources to help the College extend itself. The responses were varied, stimulating and provocative. It is our goal to approach the business community objectively, knowing that Fontbonne graduates are the kind of individuals who enrich the quality of life in the St. Louis area.

While taking a vigorous approach in our efforts to project Fontbonne outward, we have been equally energetic in focusing on the internal dynamics of the College. Particularly important is the efficiency with which we operate academic and staff departments and the methods of information proc-

essing. Steps have been taken to reduce the number of faculty in areas of study where the demand has slackened. A three-year plan is being developed to bring the student to faculty ratio to 14 to 1. Academic departments are reviewing their curricula in order to continue providing courses relevant to today's diverse student populace. Certain staff positions have been eliminated or combined with the goal of operating an effective and efficient college. A reduction in numbers made resources available to improve staff salaries.

In March, the installation of a new administrative management information systems began, thus putting into solid evidence our desire to strengthen the management systems at Fontbonne. An agreement with Concordia Seminary has been reached whereby Fontbonne intercollegiate athletic teams will use Concordia facilities for practice and home games. In addition, students will have additional space for recreational activities. The recent reorganization of the physical plant and food service departments further illustrate our goal of organizing our human talents as carefully as possible to fulfill the mission of the College—providing quality academic programs in an environment conducive to learning.

In looking at the year as a whole, I'm perhaps most impressed with the support the alumni has provided. My heartfelt thanks go to all the alumni and especially to Jeanne Dulle Moore, alumni association president; Ruth O'Neill Strohle, trustee development committee chairperson; and Colette Crowley O'Brien, alumni annual fund chairperson. The continuing growth in financial support and the energetic efforts point not only to alumni satisfied with their past experience but to a group of individuals confident of Fontbonne's future.

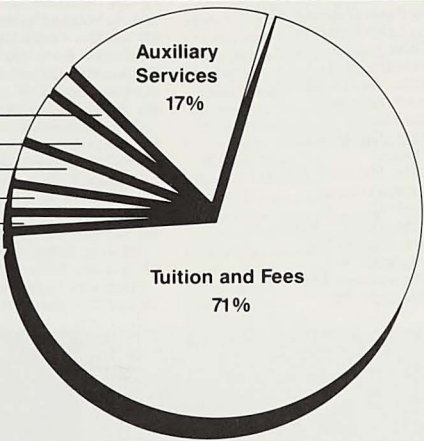

In addition to the hands-on experience, Schaltenbrand said her co-op job helps her stay up to date on changes in her field. "There are weekly alerts issued by the Federal Tax Coordinator," she said. The tax code changes may take years to reach college textbooks, if ever.

Adele Levine, president of the Cooperative Education Council of Greater St. Louis, says co-op education is a boon to students and host companies alike.

"Both benefit from the experience, but the benefits are measured differently," Levine said. "The students find how they'll do in a particular job. They gain experience and job skills."

"Employers get a cost-effective employee, and they get help at crunch times."

Schaltenbrand for example, worked through spring tax season for Stone, Carlie and Co.

According to Bill Foster, Fontbonne's director of cooperative education, students and host companies each look at cooperative education as a first step toward permanent employment. "Ninety percent of our co-op students get an offer from their employer, based on their co-op experience. And 84 percent of the co-op students stay with their employer," Foster said.

"The companies go into cooperative education as a recruiting tool—a way to get the best and brightest," Foster said.

Cooperative education began in 1906 at the University of Cincinnati School of Engineering as a way to get engineering students into their first job. Antioch College in Ohio used co-op education for liberal arts students for the first time in the mid-1950s.

"Still," said Foster, "most co-op education openings are in the high-need fields such as engineering and accounting. It's hard to get businesses to offer a co-op position because it's a paid position."

Fontbonne places about 50 students each year in co-op positions.

In fields where demand for new graduates is slightly less frantic, or where union rules prohibit paying non-employees, cooperative education positions are nearly impossible to find.

Still, most academic departments at Fontbonne require that students get hands-on experience as part of their education. The solution is internship and practicums.

Broadcast major Keith Yex spent two days each week during the spring semester working as a reporter for radio station KXOK AM in St. Louis. "This internship has surpassed my wildest dreams of ever being able to do anything like this in the St. Louis area," Yex said, dropping his serious radio voice for a moment of high-pitched excitement.

Armed with a portable tape recorder, Yex covered five or six stories for the radio station each day he worked. "That includes going out for the interview, cutting down the tape, and writing the scripts," Yex said.

"Most of my stories are the first or second ones aired in the five-minute newscast. To me, that means I'm doing what's expected of me. In the radio business, there's just not much room for amateurs."

Yex's news reports were broadcast throughout the St. Louis area and to other major cities. "KXOK is part of the Tribune Radio Network, so my coverage of the Illinois AFL-CIO conference in Collinsville (just across the river from St. Louis) was picked up by WGN in Chicago. I was really proud of that."

Though he's covered everything from fires to political banquets, Yex says his favorite assignment was covering the local angle of the TWA flight attendants strike.

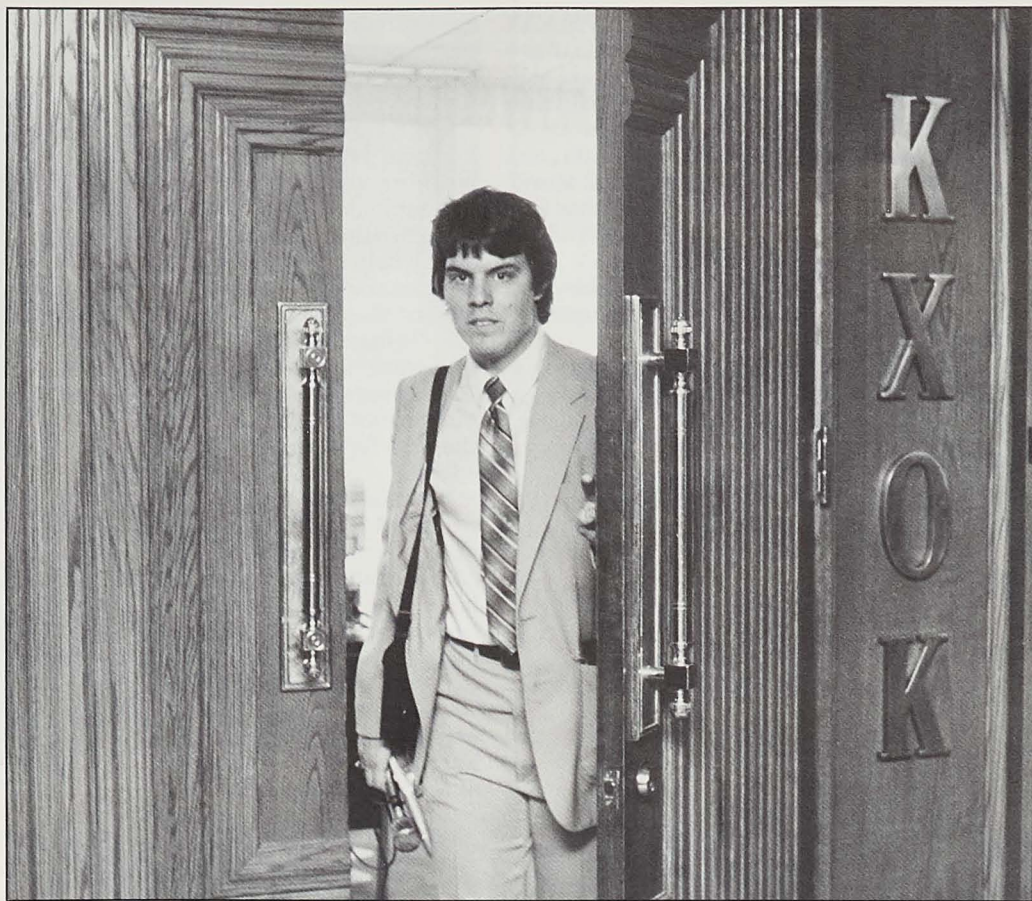

"That was the longest, hardest day I ever worked," he said. "I provided KXOK with the best local coverage of the strike. We smoked (rival station) KMOX. I happened to be in the right place at the right time to pick up on a confrontation between the attendants and the scabs."

"When I asked an airport official about it later it was the first time the other reporters heard about it. On the TV news that night they were talking about 'reports of an earlier confrontation between the attendants and scabs.' They were talking about what I reported."

Yex acquired his broadcasting skills through a cooperative program offered by Fontbonne's Department of Communication Arts and the nationally known Broadcast Center in St. Louis.

The training at Broadcast Center includes writing, working on the air, conducting promotions, and operating technical equipment. "It's really a good perspective of what the business is like in St. Louis for radio and television professionals," Yex said.

According to Sister Marie Damien Adams, CSJ, vice president for academic affairs and dean, all of Fontbonne's degree programs include professional experience. "It's been part of the programs in this college since we've had career-oriented programs," Sister Adams said.

The college's liberal arts requirements complements Fontbonne's career-oriented professional training, according to Sister Adams. "The liberal arts graduate is better able to respond to the lifelong challenges. It makes a more well-rounded individual," Sister Adams said, "one who has a wide knowledge of life rather than the narrow perspective of a career and profession."

In the late 1960s colleges and universities rushed to include practical experience in their curriculums, pushing the liberal arts and the well-rounded graduate from the forefront. "We've tried not to compromise the liberal arts, but we have compromised somewhat," Sister Adams said.

Colleges once required all course work be in the liberal arts. Fontbonne now requires that at least one third, but less than half of the courses be selected from outside the student's major. "It's a good balance," Sister Adams said. "Employers have told us they are looking for the well-rounded graduates. Our people are trained as well as the graduate from a more technical school, but they are also able to learn new skills."

"One of the fringe benefits of the co-op programs and the internships is that employers can see how valuable the well-rounded students are," Sister Adams continued. "The student often gets that first job and the company gets a good employee."

In addition to the cooperative education program and the internships, Fontbonne has established permanent practicum sites. These professional positions are filled each semester by Fontbonne students.

Tamara Gebhardt, a graduate student in communication disorders, worked four hours a day, five days a week for the past year as a speech pathologist for the Veterans Administration Hospital at Jefferson Barracks in St. Louis.

Gebhardt sat surrounded by middle age and elderly men. The men are aphasics—stroke victims on the road to recovery. During the course of the morning Gebhardt leads the group through discussions, craftmaking, lunch and other activities.

"We're working to incorporate speech into real life activities," Gebhardt explained. "Like today, we're sending out for hamburgers. They have to say what they want, exchange money, make change. It's non-directive treatment. It's also a support group for these men."

As a paid trainee, Gebhardt evaluates and treats a variety of communication disorders under the supervision of practicing speech pathologists. She is also learning about careers in speech pathology. "A speech pathologist fits into a lot of different settings I wasn't even aware of when I started college—children, adults, hospitals, private practice. I could make a

career switch within my field later if I want to," Gebhardt said.

The link between area hospitals and Fontbonne makes traineeships such as Gebhardt's possible. The directors of audiology at both St. Louis Veterans Administration Hospitals teach courses at Fontbonne, as do professionals from other local institutions.

"At the VA Hospital I'm working with other professionals," Gebhardt said. "It's a chance to exchange ideas. I've learned a lot."

Gebhardt has learned a lot about her field and her patients as well. "I get a great deal of satisfaction seeing people develop functional communication skill. When communication is away, it devastates the person. As aphasics, these men haven't lost language. They just can't get to it easily in their brains. There are roadblocks."

During the nine months she has spent working with the group, Gebhardt has had the opportunity to both direct and watch improvements ranging from subtle to dramatic.

Companies where Fontbonne students work acknowledge the benefits of getting practical experience while in college.

Golden Dipt Company, a Division of DCA Food Industries, Inc., sponsors an internship program for students of Foods and Nutrition and Dietetics at Fontbonne.

In explaining the program, Dr. Mario de Figueiredo, vice president of research and development for Golden Dipt, said, "We know from experience that it can be very helpful to a student aspiring to make a career in the food and nutrition field to

have some exposure to a commercial company such as ours, and to actually experience working in research and development for our company while still a student.

"This gives a student a rare opportunity to get the feel of an actual job in industry, which should prove to be very helpful in determining what phase of food and nutrition most interests her or him, and to help direct the student in aiming the remainder of her or his college career toward that goal," de Figueiredo said.

"It may be that a student may decide that working with a commercial company such as ours is not what she or he wants to pursue, but we still feel it is well worth the time for both of us," Dr. de Figueiredo added.

Centerre Bank N.A. vice president and president of Centerre subsidiary Market Street Securities, Richard G. Flynn said, "A practicum is so important because it helps with career choice, it gives a student exposure, and it helps them get a step ahead. It's important for students to have exposure outside the hallowed halls."

Business administration/management major Tom Wilkerson leaped from the hallowed halls of Fontbonne to the fast lane of investment banking for his practicum.

Wilkerson opted for the Centerre practicum because he was interested in banking and finance. "This has not only increased my interest, but has helped me decide where I want to focus my career," Wilkerson said.

He spent 15 to 24 hours per week at the bank's downtown St. Louis office building, monitoring investment accounts, posting trade reports and tallying commis-

sions. As an apprentice of sorts to Flynn, Wilkerson sat in on meetings, took telephone calls, and watched Flynn operate.

"What I observe, this is real life," Wilkerson said. "You really get a feel for the banking industry. I've been a shadow to Mr. Flynn. I learn a lot from him just by listening to his phone calls—what he says, how he handles them."

For his part, Flynn said he enjoyed having Wilkerson at Centerre. "The whole thing has worked fine," Flynn said. "With Tom here, I won't 'glaze' things."

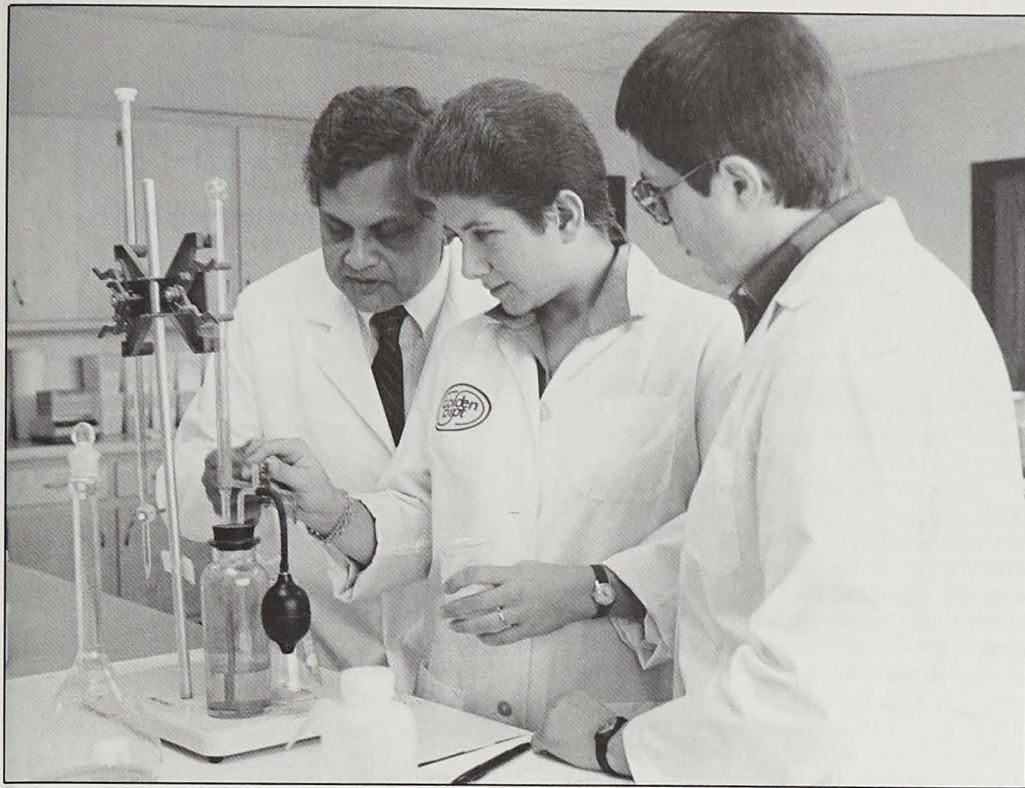
Flynn said he made sure Wilkerson experienced all of the "grunt work" involved in the business world including filing and writing letters and reports. "I think all college graduates should have a course in business writing or even shorthand. It's critical these students have those communication qualities they can use all their lives—oral skills, listening skills," Flynn said.

For the soft-spoken Wilkerson, the practicum at Centerre has sparked new, higher ambitions and possibly changed his life. "I first thought I would go into sales," he said, "but now I like investing. Working with money is really interesting. It's fascinating that money is just as much a commodity as cars."

Wilkerson's practicum at Centerre has whet his appetite for more education and possible careers in finance. He graduates this fall and plans to return to begin Fontbonne's 52-Saturday MBA program. "I want to get my master's and get into financial planning," Wilkerson said. "I want to help people use, save, and invest money."

Fontbonne has always tried to ensure that its interns, trainees and co-op students work in reasonably businesslike surroundings. But that's not always possible. Sometimes the office can be a real zoo.

Jo Fechner, Karen Jones, and Chris Splisgardt spent much of their spring semester sitting in the St. Louis Zoological Park watching the animals. For their community service, required for all seniors in the early childhood/early childhood special education program in home economics, these three women revised materials used in the zoo's "On the Move" program.

"On the Move" is a packet of information the zoo sends to teachers to show young students how animals move.

Fechner said changes to the book have been minor, but they have added some new materials for the program. Additions to the program include a series of lesson plans for the teacher. "They could write their own lesson plans," Fechner said, "but this is already done for them by professional educators. It'll help them."

The students agreed that revising the "On the Move" program has been beneficial for all concerned. Said Fechner, "We're not sitting in the zoo directing visitors. The zoo has put us to work making something they can use. It'll benefit us. It'll benefit the zoo. It'll benefit the teachers who get this packet."

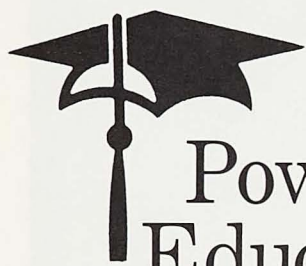
When their revision of "On the Move" was completed, the students compiled their observations of the traits and habits of animals and decided to work on a new program, "Animal Awareness."

"Animal Awareness" will serve as a pre-visit activities guide for teachers of preschoolers. "It lets kids learn about the animals they are going to see at the zoo," Fechner said. "Then when they get to the zoo, they touch the animals, learn about them. When they go back to preschool the teacher can answer questions posed by the kids, using the materials we're putting together."

As early childhood educators, Fechner, Jones and Splisgardt may find themselves working with the same materials they developed during their senior year community service. "I have enough information on animals to last a lifetime," Splisgardt said, assessing the results of the semester's work. FCM

The Power of Education

On May 10, 1986 Fontbonne College conferred the degree of doctor of humanities, honoris causa, on Sister Miriam Therese Larkin. Sister Larkin is general superior of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet. She served as professor of philosophy and religious studies at Mount St. Mary's College, Los Angeles, Calif. Sister Larkin is recognized as an educator, a scholar, and a teacher. Excerpts from her address to the 1986 graduates follow.

Your education, like mine, has provided you with means to respond to your own hopes and fears in face of the world situation. It has developed your spirit of inquiry, your knowledge of the world and of ideas, your knowledge of principles and skills, your understanding of your intuition—all that you need in order to comprehend the human situation and to change it. You leave here more immediately concerned about your profession or your job, and that is understandable. But it really does not matter so much what kind of job or profession you pursue. It matters much more what kind of stance you take toward the world you live in, no matter how small may be your scope of every day action.

You can use the knowledge and the skills you have acquired to look outward on your society and on this world in different ways: as spectators or as fully engaged agents of life; with wide interest or with narrow scope; with a large heart open to goodness or with narrow interests limited to personal concerns and personal security; with faith and hope that accept miracles and take risks, or with pessimism that sees no hope; with imagination that sees and pursues possibilities, or with the blindness of apathy.

The knowledge, skill and understanding you have acquired constitute power for you—power that you would not have, had you not had this education. This power has deep significance for the quality of human and social life. For the most part each of us loves life and in return we ask that life love us. We ask life to tell us that we are significant. Eager for an affirmative answer from life, we sometimes supply the answer ourselves. We judge ourselves attractive because we have wealth, or power, or fame or developed talents, the possibility of which is enhanced by education. Possession of wealth, power, fame, talent, can too easily symbolize for us the way in which life loves us. But the moral question is whether we use the power derived from education merely to exempt ourselves from the less desirable conditions of life and to build our individual lives, or whether we use the power to transform the conditions of life. The power of education is not to be used to organize our own lives so that we are exempt from the fate of the powerless. Education can lead to a reduction of the distance between the powerful and the powerless. It should lead

us not to the exclusion of others but to an ever widening circle of inclusion of all persons.

I encourage you today to take hold of your lives, to move beyond the narrowness of a self-indulgent life obsessed with physical health, material comfort, personal growth.

Your greatest error will be to take a narrow view of yourself, of who you are, of what you can do. Your greatest folly will be to think that you can or must do it all, to require that you be able to measure what you have done. Your wisdom will be to be able to distinguish between what you can master in life and what you must, in humility, accept and bow before as simply part of the mystery that life is. Sometimes love will provide you with courage; at times love will seem to fail you.

We see so much goodness and beauty in the people with whom we come in contact each day. Yet, if we take a broad look at the world and at the society in which we live, the reality may appear stark. But we must say with the poet (Christopher Fry):

"Dark and cold we may be—but this is no winter now.

The frozen misery of the centuries breaks—cracks—begins to move.

The thunder is the thunder of the flocks—the flood—the upstart spring.

Thank God our time is now when wrong comes up to face us everywhere never to leave us until we take the longest stride of soul (we) man ever took.

Affairs are now soul size.

(Our) The enterprise is exploration into God."

This exploration unto God for which education prepares us is our participation in God's saving and redemptive work of justice, peace and love. The moment one commits oneself, then providence moves too. All sorts of things occur to help one that would never otherwise have occurred. A whole stream of events will issue from the decision, raising in your favor all manner of events which no one could have dreamt would come your way! So, as Goethe says,

"Whatever you can do, or dream you can do, begin it, for Boldness has genius and magic in it."
