The Catholic Intellectual Tradition in the Curriculum

The FCC received a final report from Dr. Randall Rosenberg and Dr. Mary Beth Gallagher on their project titled "The Catholic Intellectual Tradition in the Curriculum." (CIT) The grant allowed them to develop several tools for faculty use in the classroom. Tools developed include:

- A 50-minute PowerPoint presentation discussing the foundations of the CIT
- A PowerPoint module on the compatibility and complementarity of faith and science
- A PowerPoint module on the history and challenges of Catholic Identity in Catholic Universities today
- An enhanced website for the Sisters of St. Joseph on Carondelet Endowed Chair in Catholic Thought (ECCT) that includes all the materials and presentations along with announcements and upcoming events related to the CIT http://www.fontbonne.edu/ academics/undergraduate/departments/

To inform faculty members of the project and materials available, they presented the CIT PowerPoint to several classes, they also spoke individually with faculty members from diverse departments to discuss using the presentation and sent an electronic message to all faculty regarding the program and materials. It was also announced to all faculty at the All Campus Meeting in October.

They extended their many thanks and gratitude to the FCC for the support of their project. This project has helped them to further understand the Catholic Intellectual Tradition and how alive that tradition is at Fontbonne. This will also help faculty and students to understand and appreciate the CIT even more.

They are willing to offer a 15-minute version of the presentation to the FCC at any time.

Cold Feat

The Department of Biological and Physical Sciences purchased an Arctic-Temp double-door refrigerator with funds approved by the FCC. This piece of equipment has been and will continue to be extremely valuable to biology students conducting research projects, as reactions have been found to occur more readily in cold temperatures. This piece of equipment is configured to allow a scientist to work inside the unit, preserving the integrity of the research in progress.

"An example of its value is that it has allowed me to mentor a couple of students in a research project involving the staining of butterfly wings," said Elizabeth Rayhel, Biology Department Chair. "The refrigerator also has an added value to students enrolled in the biotechnology course." The impact of having the proper equipment for re-

search is immeasurable. Biology alums often report research opportunities as one the most impactful experiences of their undergraduate curriculum. Rayhel said it is due to the FCC's generosity that Fontbonne can focus on increasing our ability to serve students in this area.



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A Tribute to Kathy

A Legacy of Leadership and Service



Kathleen Atchity Coco, 1944 – 2012

Kathy Coco was called to Heaven on Thursday, October 18, 2012, exactly one week after Pope Benedict declared 2013 to be a "Year of Faith." Kathy's strength and leadership were unparalleled and instrumental to the founding of the Fontbonne Community Connection. As a charter member, Kathy can be fondly remembered for her feverish work developing the grant guidelines that guide the FCC's annual review process.

It was shortly after enrolling at Fontbonne University in 1962 that Kathy quickly became consumed with the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet's vision to serve the dear neighbor without distinction. She began spending summers as a camp counselor for the mentally impaired, and took advantage of every opportunity she could to serve others.

Kathy also chose to pursue a career of service. Following graduation from Fontbonne, she began working for the University City School District. She met and married the love of her life, Matteo Coco, and raised four handsome young men. She and her husband were active in their church as well as their children's schools. They also routinely served meals to the homeless.

Following her mother's footsteps, Kathy joined the Ladies of Charity. As a member, Kathy spent countless hours sorting clothing for monthly rummage sales, organizing fundraisers, restocking the food pantry, and tutoring disadvantaged elementary school students.

Several years after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina, Kathy learned about some 200 homes still in need of repair. In customary enthusiastic fashion, she quickly spearheaded a group of St. Vincent Junior Ladies of Charity to go to New Orleans to meet the call for help.

In spring 2012, Kathy accepted an appointment to serve as president of the Ladies of Charity of St. Vincent De Paul Church. Having organized the church's first walk-a-thon, she also was approached and agreed to plan its fourth. The walk-a-thon is scheduled for Carondelet Park in September 2013. Always true to commitment, the walk will be held in Kathy's memory and she will be with all participants in spirit to facilitate its success.

The Pope's call for people to live a "Year of Faith" has been beautifully demonstrated by Kathy, who chose to live a *life of faith*. We are forever grateful for knowing her and will eternally find inspiration from the contributions she made to our lives.

Digitizing and Indexing the FONT

During the 2012-2013 fiscal year, Jane Theissen received a FCC grant for digitizing and indexing the FONT (years 1947-1963). Sister Jane, archivist and fellow FCC member, explains the significance. "The early (Font) papers, which have been kept in their original form, are fragile from age and cannot be safely handled without some degree of damage. The FCC's support is allowing the library to preserve the Font's history by making them available digitally." To all making this project possible, we thank you.
