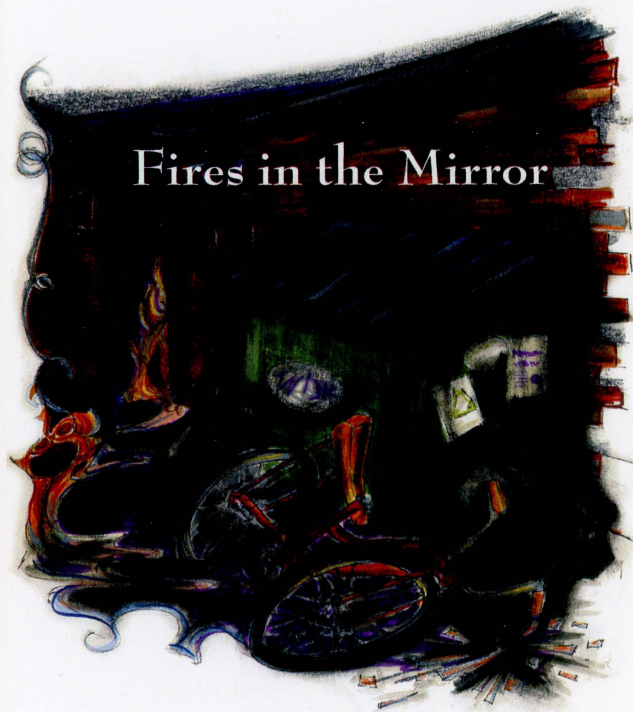


Fiddler on the Roof
