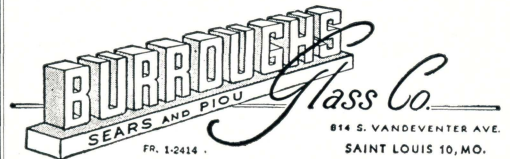

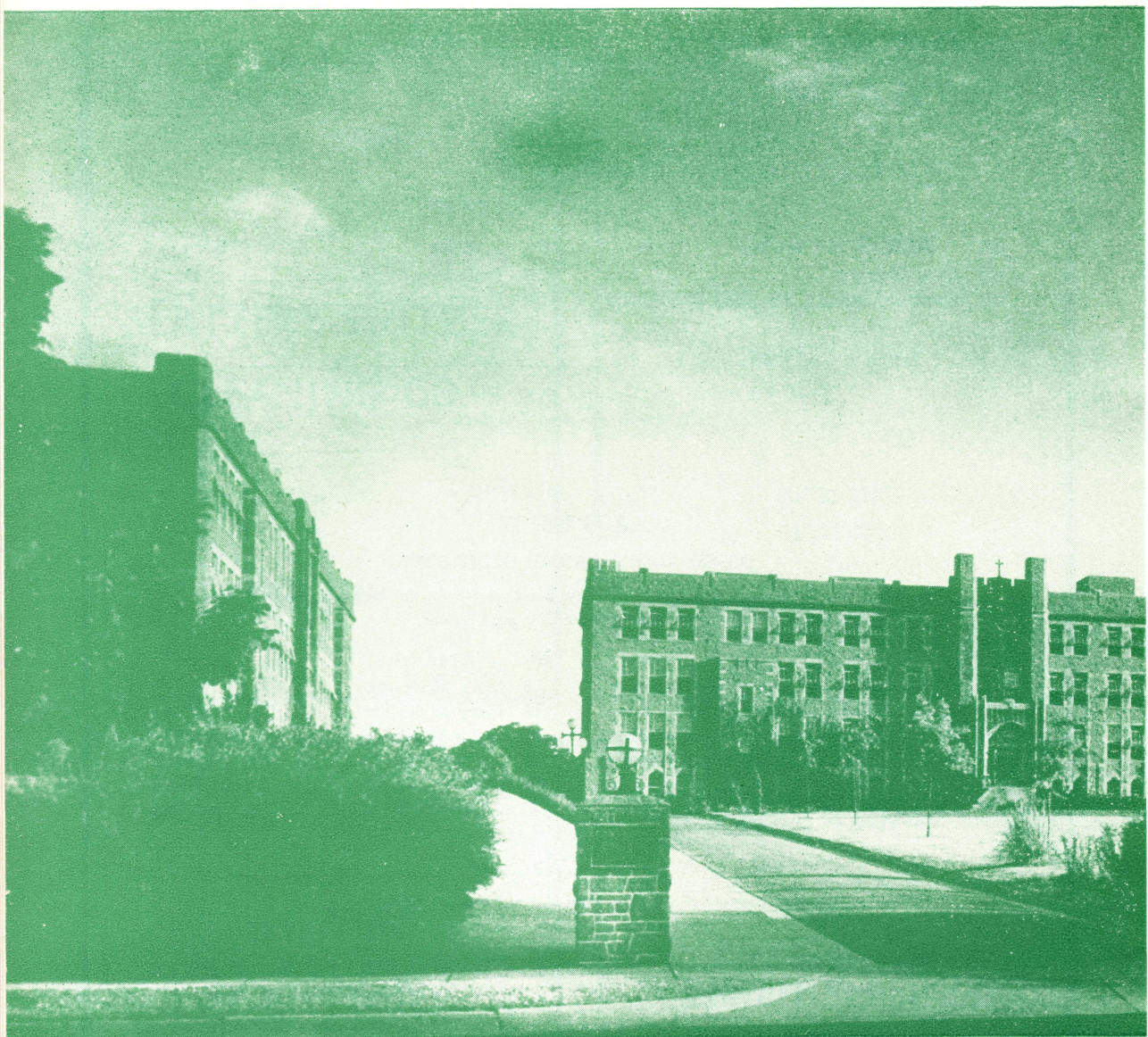

FONTBONNE and ST. JOSEPH'S

Have old and rich tradition

THE STORY of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, who conduct St. Joseph's Academy and Fontbonne College, began in 1650 when the Rev. Peter Medaille, S.J., founded the sisterhood in Le Puy, France.

In the United States, it began in 1836 when, at the request of Bishop Rosati, six Sisters of St. Joseph came from Lyons, France to the tiny village of Carondelet, Missouri, to establish their first convent in a two-room log cabin.

Since then the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet have gone all over the United States and Hawaii to serve God by establishing schools, hospitals, children's homes, and other welfare institutions.

Fontbonne College, established in 1923, is a four-year liberal arts college, offering bachelor's degrees in arts, science, and music. It is a corporate college of St. Louis University and is, in addition, individually accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

St. Joseph's Academy, which since 1841 has served the young girls of this Archdiocese as a high school, is also accredited by the North Central Association.

In both schools, the Sisters work to prepare their students morally, spiritually, intellectually, and physically to fill the role of well-informed, intelligent Christian women in our modern complex society.

Both schools are now located on the same campus at Wydown and Big Bend Boulevards, Clayton. However, next year, St. Joseph's Academy will be moved to a new site at Lindbergh and Litzsinger Roads.
