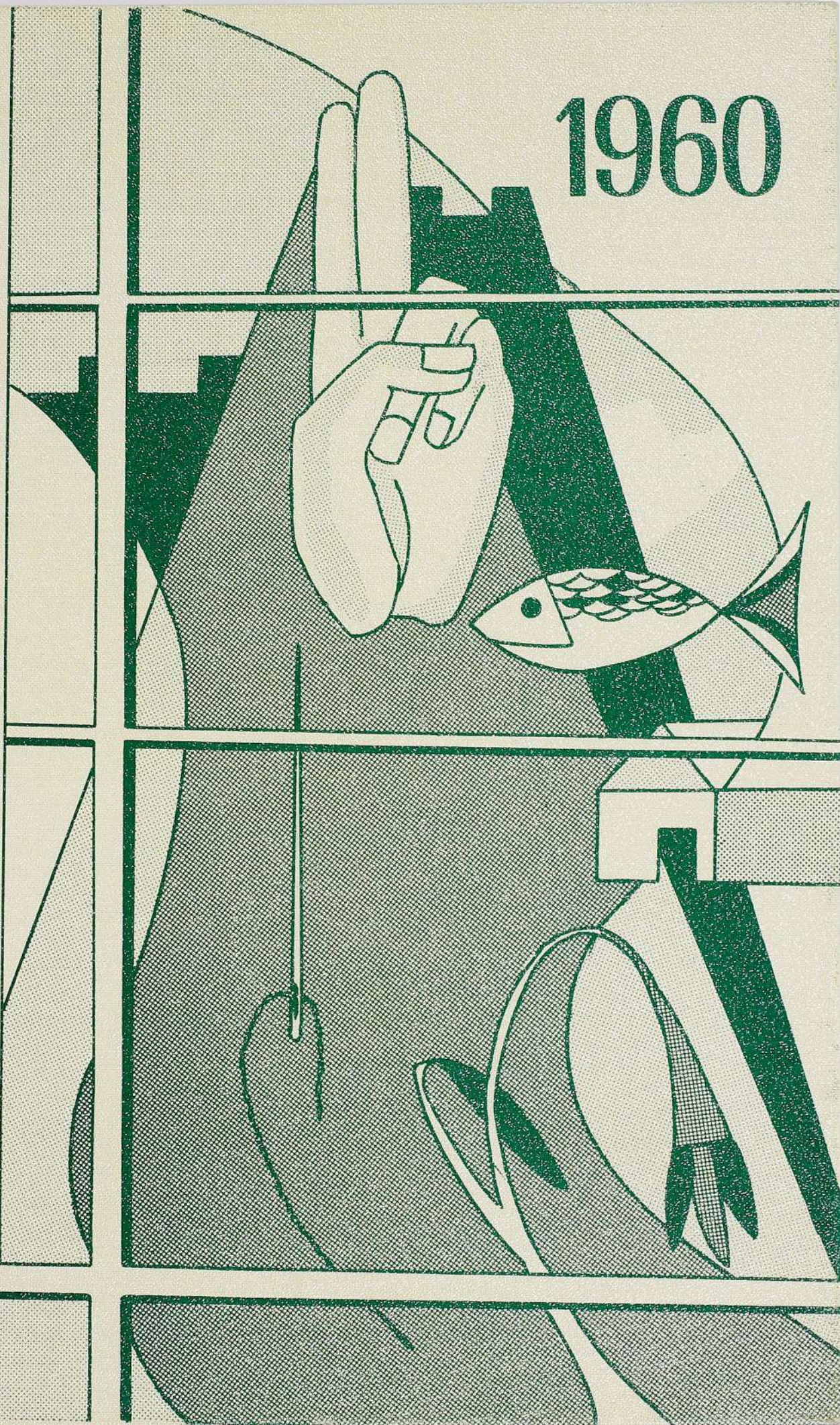

## Explanation of Cover Design

The cover and the four division pages of the 1960 **Fontbonne**, created by Art Editor Mary Ellen Matejka, are composed of symbols representing four Corporal Works of Mercy.

The cover design gives the effect of a window through which Fontbonne is seen. A hand is raised in blessing the works of mercy performed by the student lay apostle. The fish signifying food stands for the work of mercy, *To Feed the Hungry*. The house, designating a safe harbor, represents the work of mercy, *To Shelter the Homeless*. The needle and thread, symbolizing clothing, represent the work of mercy, *To Clothe the Naked*. The wilting flower, depicting sickness, stands for the work of mercy, *To Visit the Sick*.

## Dedication

The 1960 *Fontbonne* is dedicated to Dr. Thomas A. Dooley, a native St. Louisan, whose work in the medical missions of North Viet-Nam and Laos has revealed the true meaning of the lay apostolate. He has given medical care to the refugees in Haiphong, North Viet-Nam, and to the villagers of both Vang Vieng and Muong Sing, Laos. In recognition of his outstanding work, Dr. Dooley, among many awards, has received the Mutual of Omaha Cross and the National Order of Viet-Nam Medals.

Through his deeds, the author of *Deliver Us From Evil*, *The Edge of Tomorrow*, and *The Night They Burned the Mountain* proves that the brotherhood of men transcends all creeds, races, and nations. He knows that the most powerful medicine for the ills of these poor people is Charity. Dr. Dooley's belief, he says, comes directly from the first words on the Statue of Liberty: "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free."

In order to achieve this end in 1958, Dr. Dooley and Dr. Peter Comanduras founded MEDICO, the Medical International Cooperation Organization, which supplies medical teams to needy peoples of the world. In a speech delivered in St. Louis shortly before he departed for Laos, Dr. Dooley stated: "It is not enough to profess oneness with other people; we must go out and act it out." At the conclusion of the speech he recited his own poem, *Listen to the Agony of Asia*, of which two stanzas follow.

*Listen to the agony of Asia  
I who am strong with health and  
love and laughter in my soul.  
I see a throng of stunted children  
reared in wrong.  
I wish to make them whole.*

*Listen to the agony of Asia  
and know full well that until  
we share their bitter cry,  
earth's pain and hell can God within  
our spirit dwell  
and America's peace come nigh.*

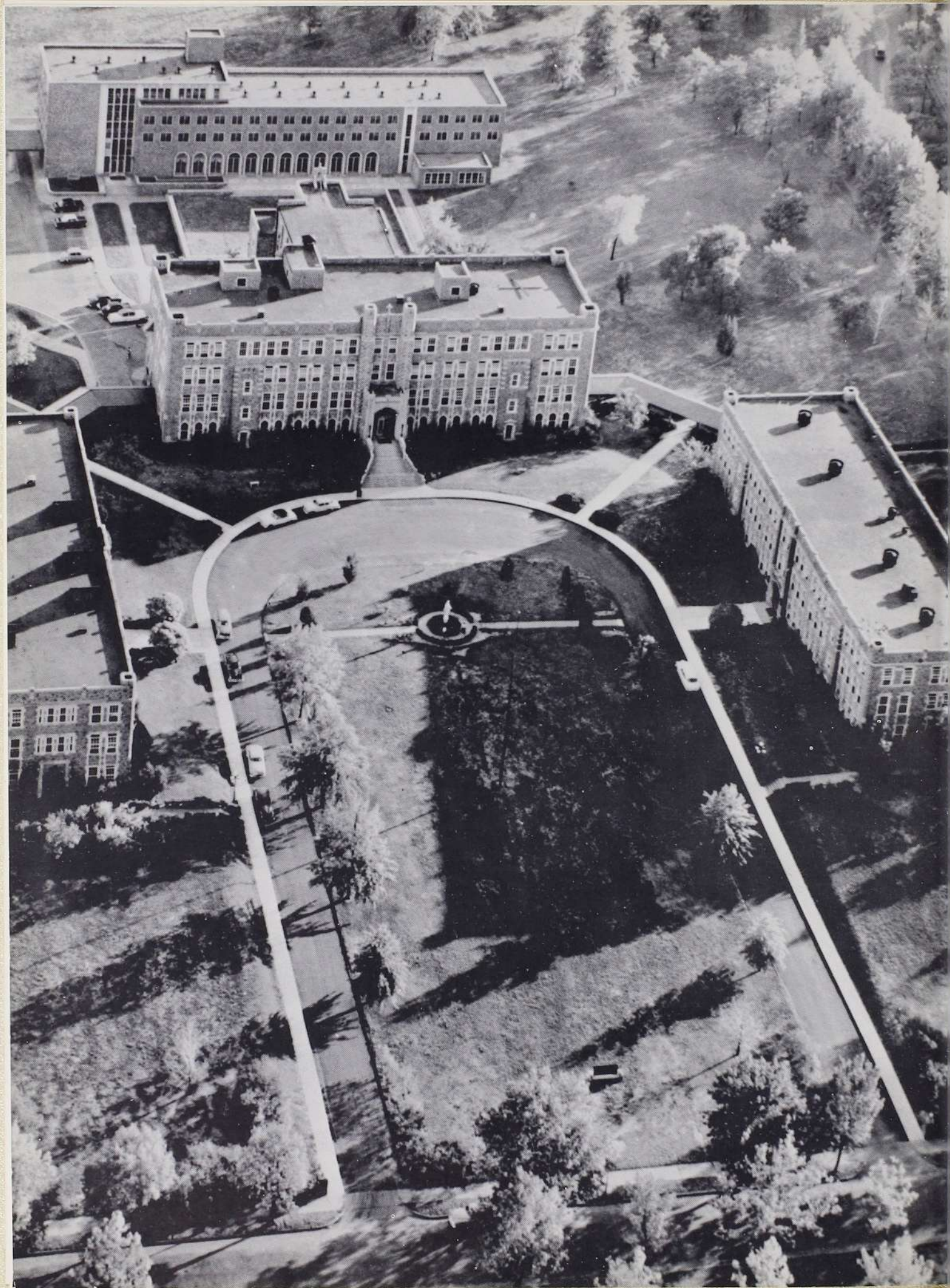

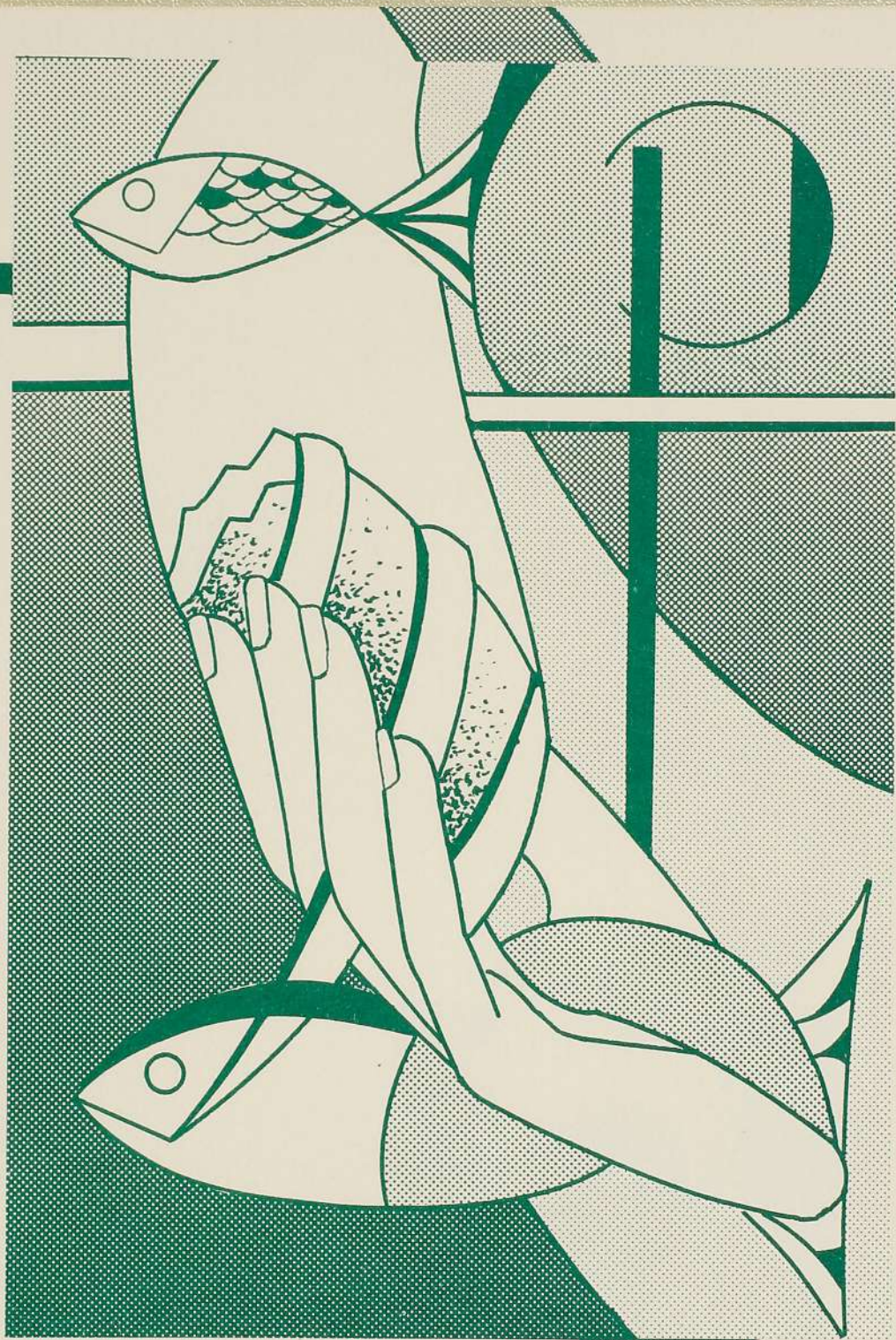




## To Feed the Hungry
