Bookstore Updates

Beginning with the Summer 21 term, Fontbonne University will transition textbook and branded merchandise services to a new bookstore model where you order your textbooks through a website and then have them delivered to you either by mail for physical books or by email for digital courseware.

The new platform is designed to provide you with affordable course materials, convenience, and choice. Created in partnership with Akademos, Inc. and powered by TextbookX, the Online Bookstore simplifies the textbook ordering process for students and professors. Below are some essential Bookstore tips:

Where is the Fontbonne Online Bookstore? Visit it online at www.fontbonne.edu/bookstore. The website is not live yet, but you will be notified when it is live for Summer 21.

How it works: When you log in to the bookstore with your Fontbonne email credentials, you will see a personalized page of the courses you registered for plus the course materials that your professors have assigned to them. You can then select from the new, used, rental, and eBook options available. You can also select from Marketplace options, which are sold by students around the country and other third-party sellers at heavily discounted prices.

What's different? Students should order their books in advance of the start of classes both to ensure they have them in time for the first day of class and to take advantage of the lowest prices available.

Delivery: You can deliver your course materials to your home or to campus.

Campus store: The new Online Bookstore will sell merchandise like hats, clothing apparel and other branded items. In addition, it will sell course supplies like notebooks and calculators. Please note, textbooks will NOT be sold on campus any longer, so please plan ahead for the upcoming academic terms by reviewing and ordering the course materials you will need at the beginning of the semester.

Bookstore benefits for students:

- · Log in to see a personalized page showing only the courses you're registered for and the corresponding course materials.
- · Select from a variety of textbook formats including new, used, eBook, and rental.

- · Shop from the Marketplace, where you can save an average of 60% off list price.
- · Price match guarantee on new books.
- · Choose from free delivery options for select orders over \$49 (not including Marketplace items).
- · Post your old textbooks for sale on the website's Marketplace (you name the price).
- · Branded merchandise like clothing, hats, and more.

Stress Less - 4-Step Plan

- 1. Move, move, move Exercise is one of the best stress relievers. Try: dance, Pilates, Spin, running, yoga, and walking!
- 2. Inhale, Exhale Deep breathing can lower your heart rate to reduce tension. Try: Breathe in through your nose, inhaling deeply so your belly rises. Focus on your breath, then do a long exhale through your mouth. Repeat for 45 to 60 second.
- 3. Five Senses Soothe yourself through your senses. Try: Scented body lotion, walk in nature, sip your favorite tea, take a shower/bath, or put on your favorite playlist.
- 4. Feel the feels talk about what's bothering you. The more you push down stress, the more it will show up in your body. Try: Talk with a friend, family member or schedule a session with a counselor at Fontbonne Counseling and Wellness. Externalize your thoughts using a journal or a notes app on your phone.
