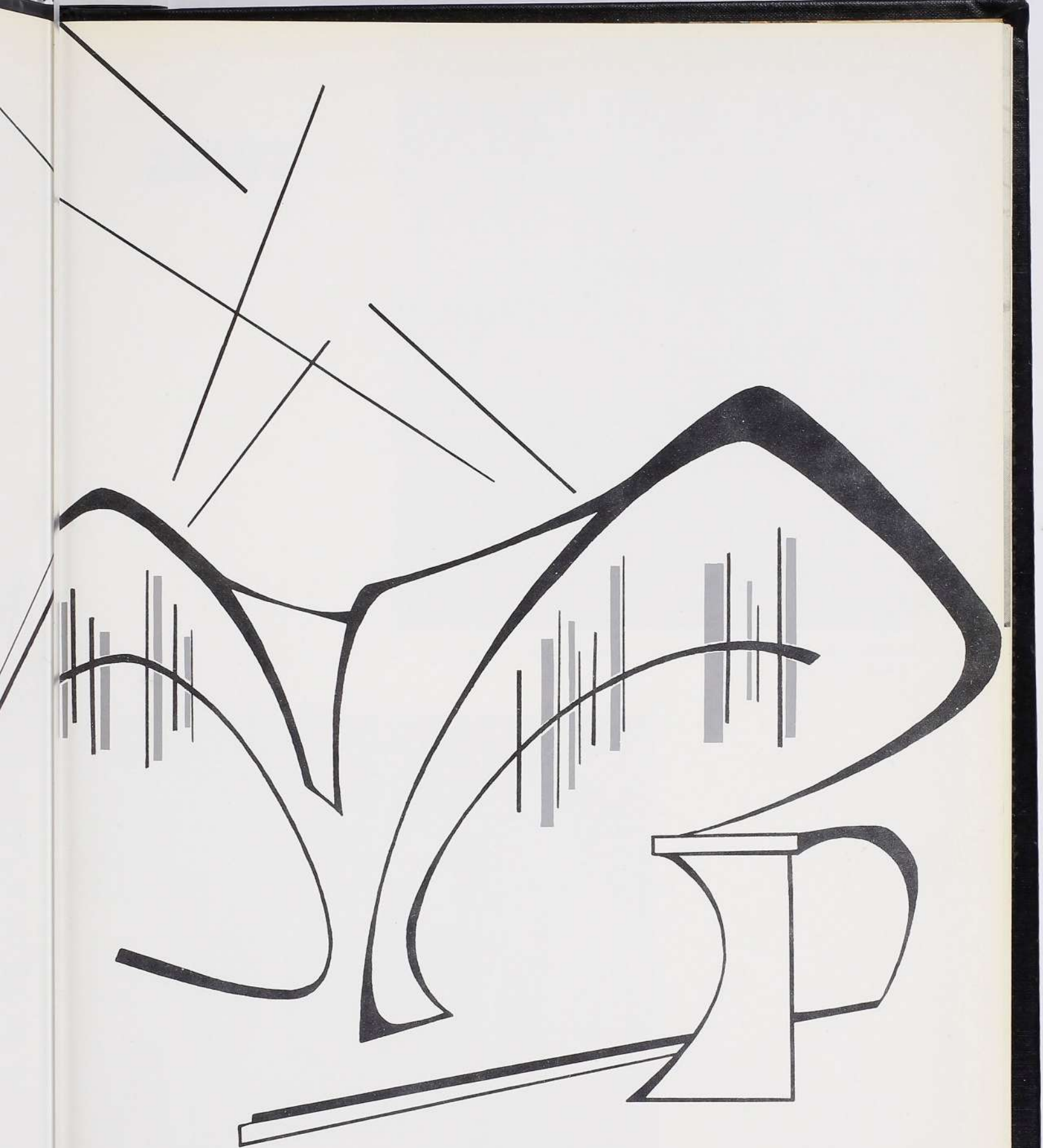




Science



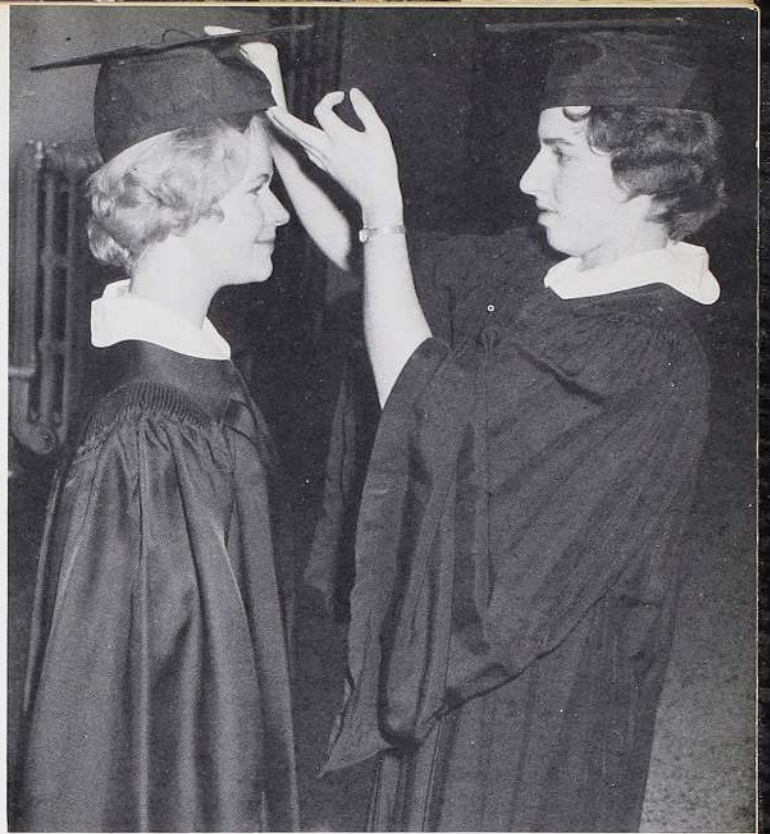
