A former resident of Kevljani, Bosnia-Herzegovina, **Kemal Pervanić** is a filmmaker, writer, and activist. His book *The Killing Days: My Journey through the Bosnian War*, was published in 1999 by Blake Publishing (London). In addition to producing and narrating *Pretty Village*, Pervanić is founder of Most Mira— “Bridge of Peace”— a British and Bosnian charity working to encourage understanding and tolerance between young Bosnians of all ethnic backgrounds (www.mostmiraproject.org).
