## Fueling for Success — FCC 2022 Award

Did you know that athletes comprise well over 50% of the student population of Fontbonne University? Student athletes are required to address both their athletic and their academic abilities. Understanding how best to fuel oneself for the activities of daily living and one's physical performance is crucial for overall health, decreasing injuries and enhancing sports and academic performance. Proper nutrition is key, and each sport has its own unique requirements. Many student athletes go to their coaches, athletic trainers,



teammates, family and friends for nutrition information, even though those sources often do not have an extensive sports nutrition background.

Dr. Jamie Daugherty (Assistant Professor/Chair, Department of Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS)) is tackling this situation with support from FCC. She proposed the creation of a nutrition support and education program to better meet student athletes' nutritional needs for both sports and academics. With oversight and mentorship provided by FCS faculty and students, a collaboration with coaches and athletic trainers will be crucial for the ongoing success of this nutrition program.

A pilot program involving three teams is already underway, combining data collection and implementation activities. Objectives include development of lesson plans to address such topics as pregame/postgame fueling and hydration, eating on the road, snacking, healthy fast-food options, trends/fad diets and supplements. In addition, hands-on cooking experiences will provide participants with nutritional supplies and other class materials for use at home.



The collaboration between the FCS and the Athletics departments exemplifies the importance of interprofessional education and the mission to continue to build opportunities for transformative education, both in and out of the classroom. FCC is excited to provide the impetus for the development of an enhanced curriculum on sports nutrition at Fontbonne and as a model for other Division III schools.



# Our Most Exciting Time Is Here: FCC Roundtables, Voting & Awards!

We have 30 preliminary requests for FCC 2023 funding, totaling \$176,686, with individual projects ranging from \$500 to \$15,600 and averaging about \$6,000 each. Your ranked voting for those proposals could not be more critical and important. Roundtables offer the greatest opportunity to learn more about each proposal and evaluate the benefits to Fontbonne. Roundtables this year will be both in person at Fontbonne and virtual (via either Zoom or call-in). You are encouraged to participate in as many sessions as possible. Final applications, summary statements and information on voting will be available to FCC members by March 1st. The voting deadline is 5 PM on March 23rd. Remember that each member's vote advances FCC's mission and purpose, as Fontbonne grows even stronger and more vibrant.

### **FCC & Lyon Society Members Celebrate**

As part of Fontbonne's Centennial commemoration, Lyon Society members were welcomed to campus for a "Christmas Through the Years" celebration on Sunday, December 11th. Many guests were FCC members, as FCC members are included in the Lyon Giving Society. Following Mass officiated by Friar Robert Barko, OFM, attendees gathered in the beautifully decorated Ryan Hall Dining Room for a holiday brunch. The creativity of Sister Linda Markway and the Advancement team had turned the area into a festive setting —



with Christmas flowers, colorful poinsettia placemats and centerpieces made of greenery from campus. Brunch included mimosas, juices and a selection of delicious food and pastries. Members of the Fontbonne staff circulated among the guests, sharing the joy of the season as they served coffee/tea. Fontbonne President Nancy Blattner welcomed all, noting achievements and upcoming key events of the Centennial year. Our freshman enrollment, one of the best in recent years, resulted in part from the recently inaugurated Sprint Football League and the BS degree offered in Nursing. Dr. Blattner announced that, due to increased enrollment of resident students, the third floor of the East Building will be converted to accommodate 45 new dorm rooms, in a unique Living/Learning space that will intermingle nursing, speech pathology and dietetics students — with the goal of enhancing skills for working with their future clients. Financing for this project is being provided in part by a \$1 million matching grant from *MoExcels*, a state funding program for private institutions.

As they departed the brunch, attendees received a very practical tote bag (big enough for lots of groceries!) and a special Fontbonne University 2023 Centennial Calendar. Each page of this keepsake calendar features a different illumination from the Saint John's Bible, along with a brief description of the illumination. All were invited to view the Saint John's Bible, on display in the Fine Arts Building, following the brunch.





## **New Member Terry Matthews Embodies FCC**

Terry Galvin Matthews majored in dietetics and graduated from Fontbonne in 1971, completed her dietetic internship at Hines Veterans Administration (VA) Medical Center in Chicago and earned a Master in Health Services Administration. She began her career as a dietitian at the VA Hospital in Danville, IL — ultimately taking a position teaching nutrition at the OSF Saint Francis Medical Center nursing school in Peoria, IL. Terry's goals were for nursing students to appreciate the importance of their nutrition coursework in their own lives and to call upon the experts (i.e., dietitians) to assist their patients.



In media interviews and presentations to professional and civic groups, Terry has been a first choice for accurate, timely information on issues involving nutrition. For fifteen years she served as the Illinois Media Representative for the American Dietetic Association (currently the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics). During this time, Terry was invited by the University of Illinois College of Medicine at Peoria to participate in a conference on colon cancer. In addition to speaking at the conference, she developed a relationship with the chairman of the committee, Larry Matthews, and later married him — that was forty years ago. The fact that Larry was already the father of eight children didn't faze Terry, as she is one of eight. She quickly became an integral part of Larry's family.

A life-long advocate for social justice, Terry has held leadership positions in the American Civil Liberties Union, the League of Women Voters and the Unitarian Universalist church. Notably on the frontlines of the 2017 Women's March on Washington, she continues participation in numerous social justice demonstrations. Since losing a nephew to leukemia, Terry has donated nearly 50 gallons of platelets. She has helped many friends clear their parents' homes (or their own), downsize and move into retirement centers. Terry is never without a dog – Blarney gets two long, daily walks to the park near their home in Washington, IL. And, although a novice, Terry took second place in a recent Women's Doubles Pickleball Tournament — impressive!

With her education, lifelong career and social justice experiences, Terry is a natural to join FCC in helping Fontbonne faculty, staff and students realize dreams and goals that might otherwise go unmet.
